





A nervous backstage grin



But as soon as I floated down the runway, all of it vanished and I was already feeling like a supermodel in my head," he recalls. It wasn't all last minute jitters either; Bhardwaj had quite a challenge healthwise, too: "Just before the show, I suffered from food poisoning

two times in a row. But I was locked in my head that this was my time. I hit the gym for two months and carefully crafted my physique without leaving room for errors. It all paid off in the end."

Onto even bigger things

In an industry where male representation on the international stage has often been limited, the 21-year-old's excitement knew no bounds when he learnt about this first. The Delhi-based model did his schooling in Uttarakhand, and shares, "It was not an easy road to reach the place where I am right now. I wish my grandparents were still alive to watch me succeed. My grandfather especially would be proud of me for accomplishing this milestone."

But this is only the beginning for this young gun, and Bhardwaj shares, "I have even bigger things on my mind that I want to do and this is just the start of it. There is a really long way ahead from here on and even bigger milestones to achieve. Right now, I feel happy for everything I have achieved."

The street as a canvas: Artist Hanif Kureshi's legacy lives on

elhi's street art has lost its lustre with the passing away of Hanif Kureshi, cofounder of St+art India. He died after succumbing to lung cancer on Sunday. Kureshi, instrumental in establishing the Lodhi Art Project, transformed the Delhi's walls into an outdoor gallery.

Throughout his career, Kureshi championed the need for public art spaces accessible to all. In a 2016 interview with Hindustan Times, he had remarked: "You might have a great studio to work and might display your work in a famous gallery, (but) it is all meaningless if no one gets to see it, so the street is the most important art gallery."

Known for his kitschy and 'desi' style, which drew inspiration from signage across the subcontinent, Kureshi graduated from MS University in Baroda before a brief stint in advertising.



The Lodhi Art Project




Chiranjeevi honoured by Guinness World Records as 'most prolific star' in the Indian film industry

olding one's own in a field as competitive as playback singing is no mean feat. But singer Neeti Mohan, who is set to complete 15 years in the industry, has managed to pull off just that.

Mohan, who first stepped into the limelight with the reality show Popstars in 2003, began her playback journey six years later when she recorded a track for the 2009 film Fruit and Nut. Reflecting on her career, the singer says she has learnt to "enjoy the process". "If you only run after numbers and hits, then you might get disappointed," she tells us, adding, "However, if you enjoy going to recording studios for rehearsals, meeting bands and travelling, you are living a life that many people don't get the chance to."

Although her breakthrough came in 2012 with tracks such as Ishq Wala Love (Student of the Year) and Jiya Re (Jab Tak Hai Jaan), she feels that making the

transition to playback was no cakewalk. Singers often wait for long periods of time for a good song to come their way and Mohan admits that the uncertainty of her early days was all too real: "There was this pattern in my career initially. You have to get used to it, sometimes days are nights and vice versa."
