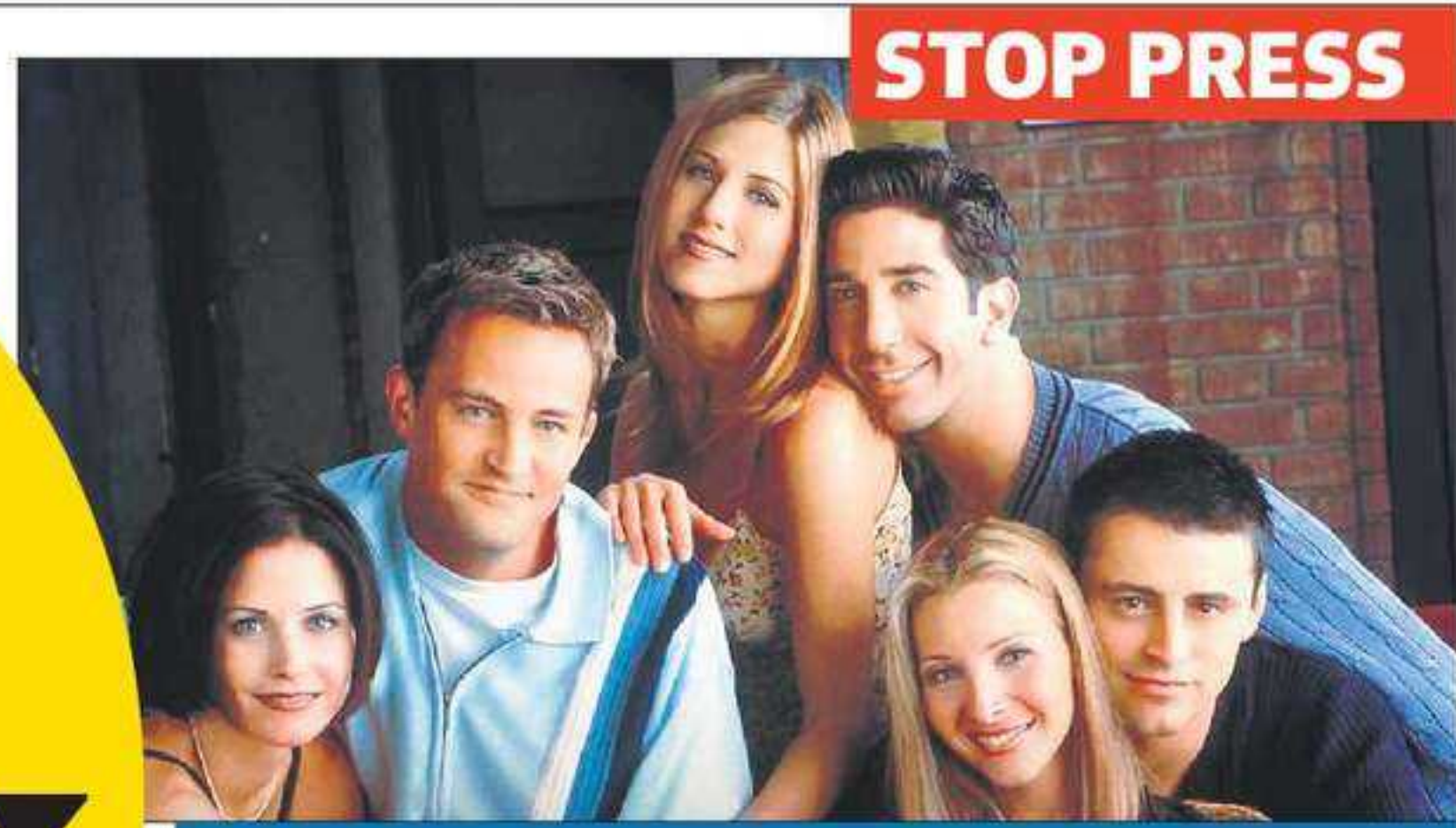

Urmila Matondkar's fans might be in for some disappointing news. The actor has apparently filed for divorce after eight years of marriage with businessman-model Mohsin Akhtar Mir. A source from a Mumbai court, on the condition of anonymity, shared that the 50-year-old actor, who got married in 2016 to the Kashmiri entrepreneur, has filed for divorce. The source said, "After careful consideration, Urmila has decided to call it quits on her marriage with Mohsin. She has already filed for divorce in court. While the reason behind the separation is still not known, the divorce isn't happening on mutual terms." Matondkar and Mir (40) got married in 2016 in an intimate ceremony at her Mumbai residence. It was a close-knit ceremony with fashion designer Manish Malhotra as one of the few in attendance from the film industry. Her nuptials came into the limelight as the two have a 10-year age gap. The actor entered politics in 2019 as a part of the Indian National Congress and then in 2020, she joined the Shiv Sena. On screen, Matondkar was last seen in a song *Bewafa Beauty* in the 2018 film *Blackmail*. Post that, she was also seen on TV as a judge for a kids dance reality show. Mir is into Kashmiri embroidery and kaarigari and is associated with Malhotra's fashion label. We reached out to Matondkar, but received no response till the time of going to press.

However, Sen confirmed that a sequel is definitely on the cards. "I don't know where this information surfaced from, it is not true. After seeing the reports, Vipul (Shah; producer) and I laughed. There will be a sequel to the film and the scripting is underway, but it has nothing to do with the Hema Committee report." 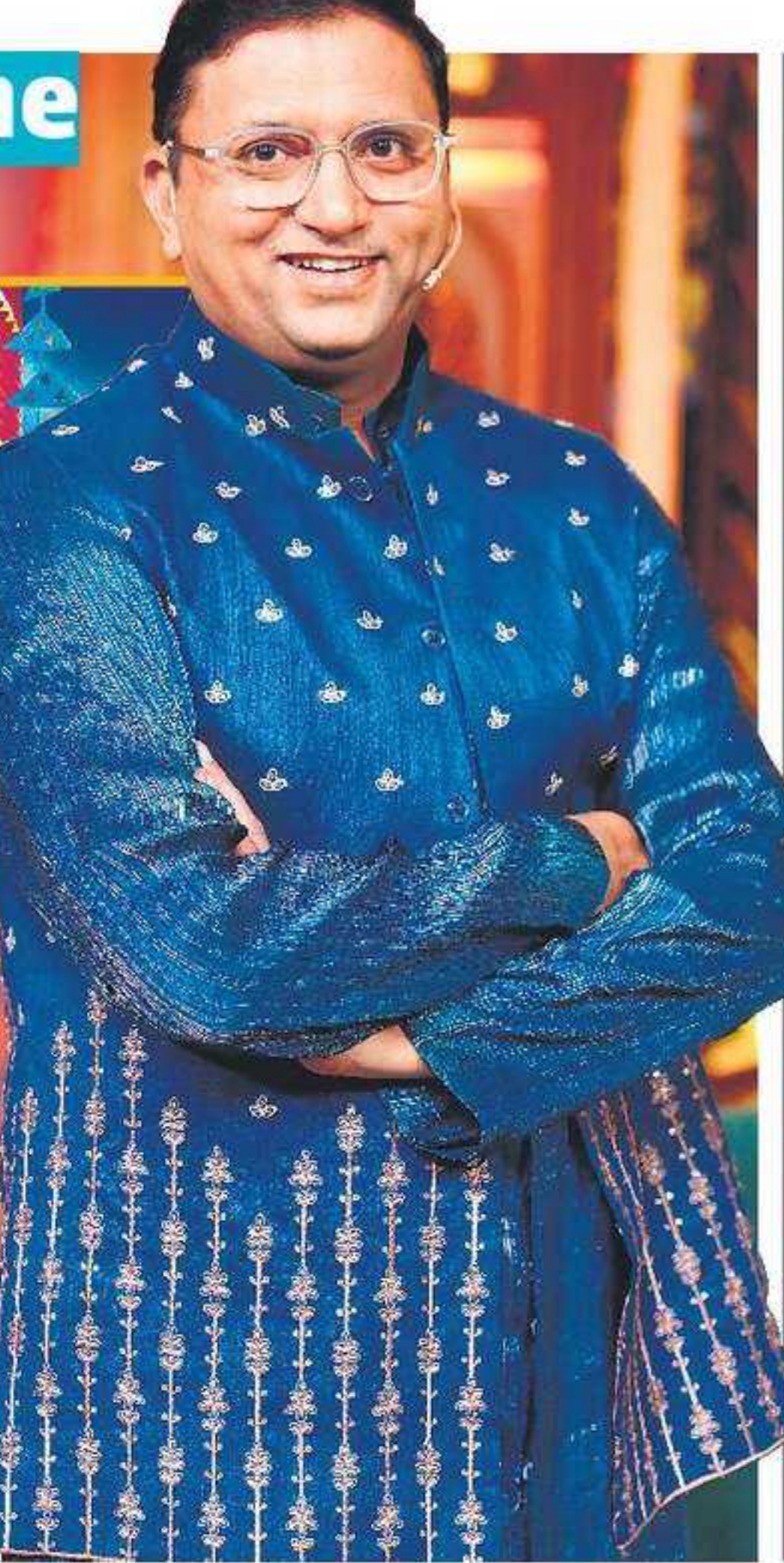

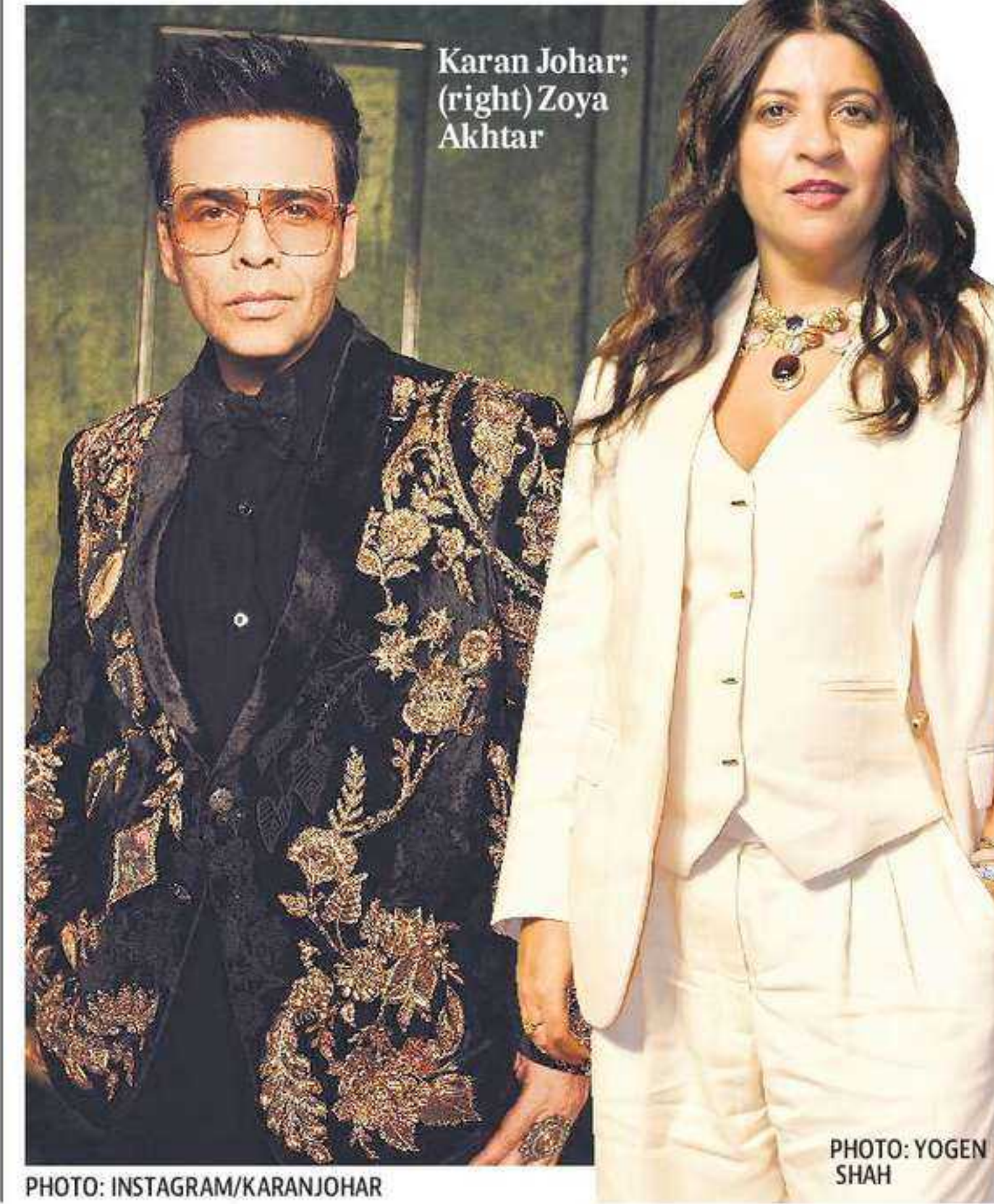

He says, "I was travelling a lot for my shows around that time, so I am not really aware of what happened. As an actor, I wanted to explore the project by adding witty dialogues and punches. I was still figuring out how to make it more interesting, but shuru hone se pehle hi bandh ho gaya toh kuch kar nahin sakte. It's because of the TRPs or whatever. I think it was still in its early stages, so to judge it so fast... thoda ajeeb hi hai." About his decision to explore TV, Datt says, "Uske fayade-nuksaan dono

hain. TV surely has a reach, but karne ko zyada kuch nahin hai. TV ki apni limitations hain. My last stint on TV was 15 years ago." However, Datt is enjoying dabbling in different mediums, including theatre. "When you work on big films, you don't have too much choice. You are just a character and the control is elsewhere. It's much better in OTT and indie projects. Theatre also gives you the liberty to take control. But uske liye paisa jeb se lagana padta hai," he says.

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Zoya Akhtar asks Karan Johar to 'just stop paying' high fees to male stars

The exorbitant remuneration charged by leading male actors in Bollywood has been a much-discussed issue in recent times, especially after films headlined by A-listers recorded low openings this year. Recently, when director-producer Karan Johar shared his views on the topic, filmmaker Zoya Akhtar highlighted how he has been a part of the problem himself. KJo insisted on the need for male stars to reassess their remuneration during a directors' roundtable conducted by The Hollywood Reporter India, when Akhtar interjected him, saying, "They are not going to know. But Karan, you have to just stop paying. That's it." On his part, Johar said that he has stopped the practice now. Recalling how every leading man quoted high prices for starring in this year's release *Kill*, he shared, "Every star asked me for the same money that the budget was for. I was like, 'How can I pay you?' When the budget (of the film) is ₹40 crore, you're asking for ₹40 crore? Are you guaranteeing the film will do ₹120 crore? So finally, I took a new boy (actor Lakshya), and he was an 'outsider.' I have to say it."

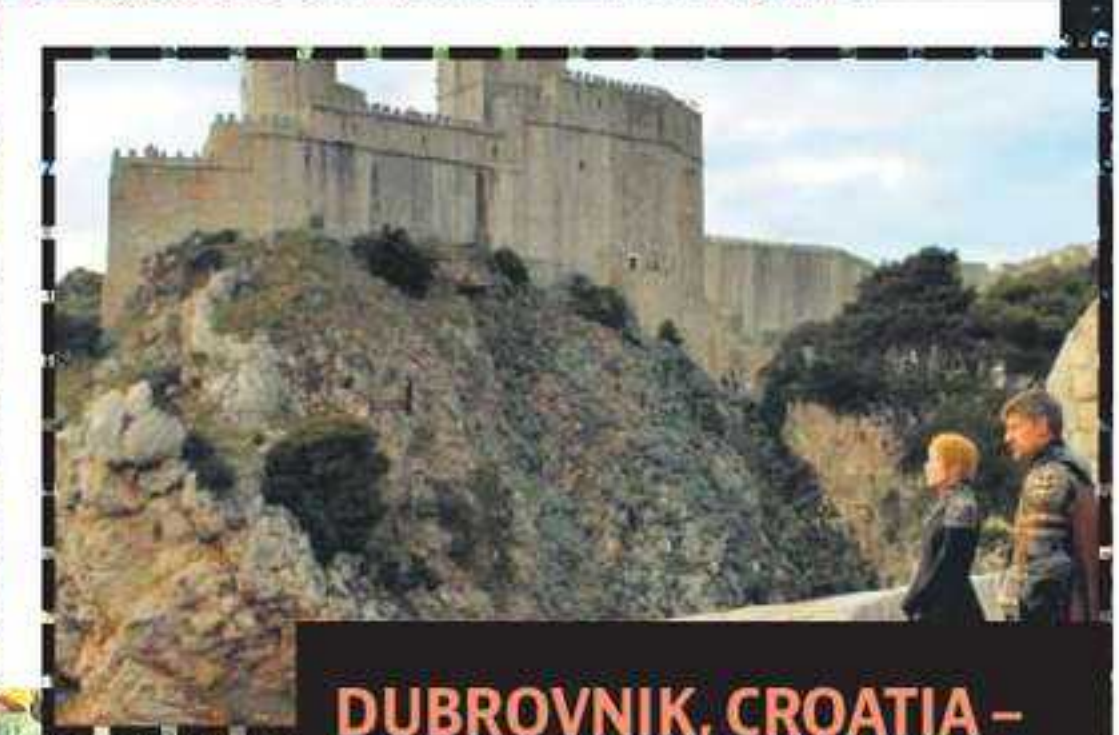
WADI RUM, JORDAN – STAR WARS SERIES

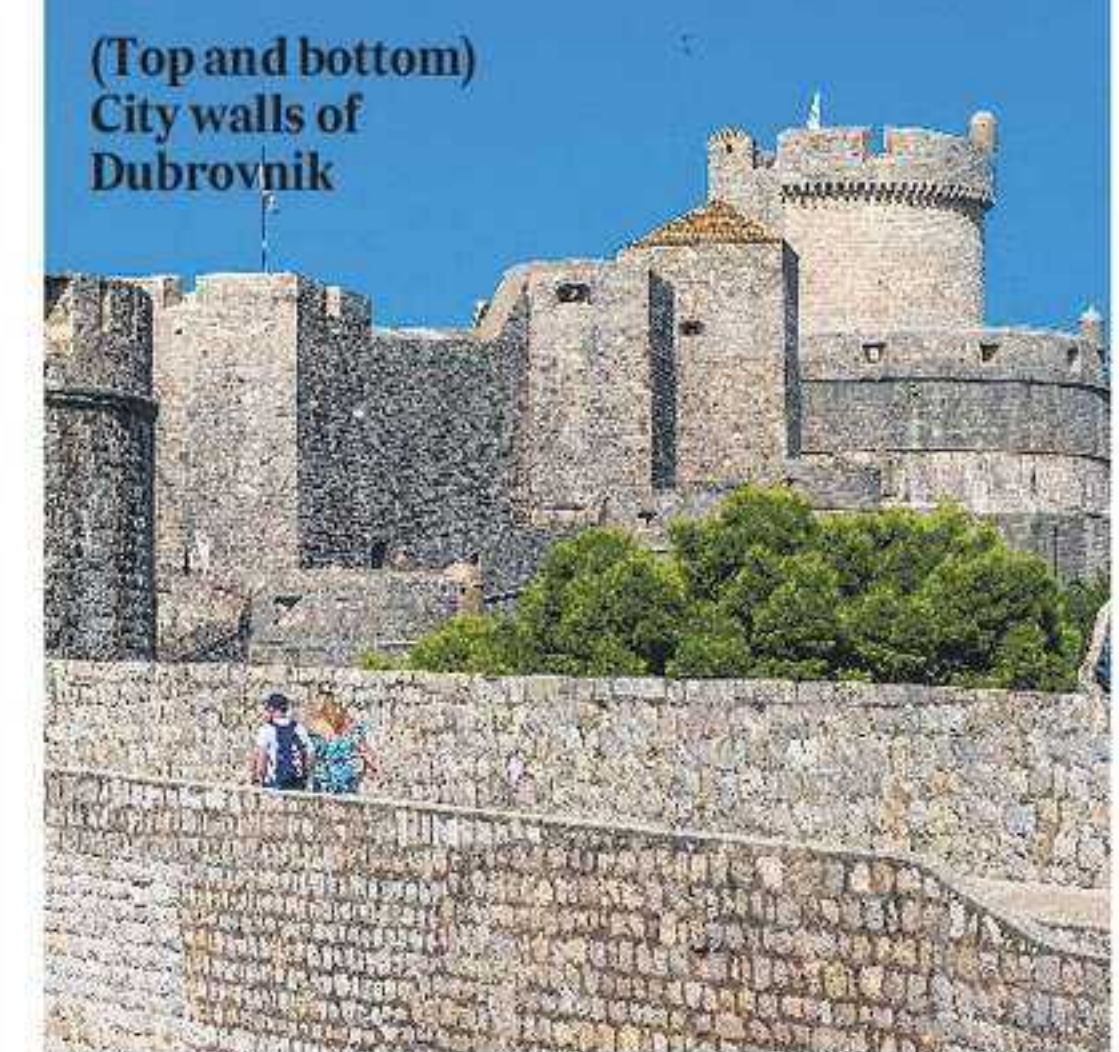
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DUBROVNIK, CROATIA – GAME OF THRONES

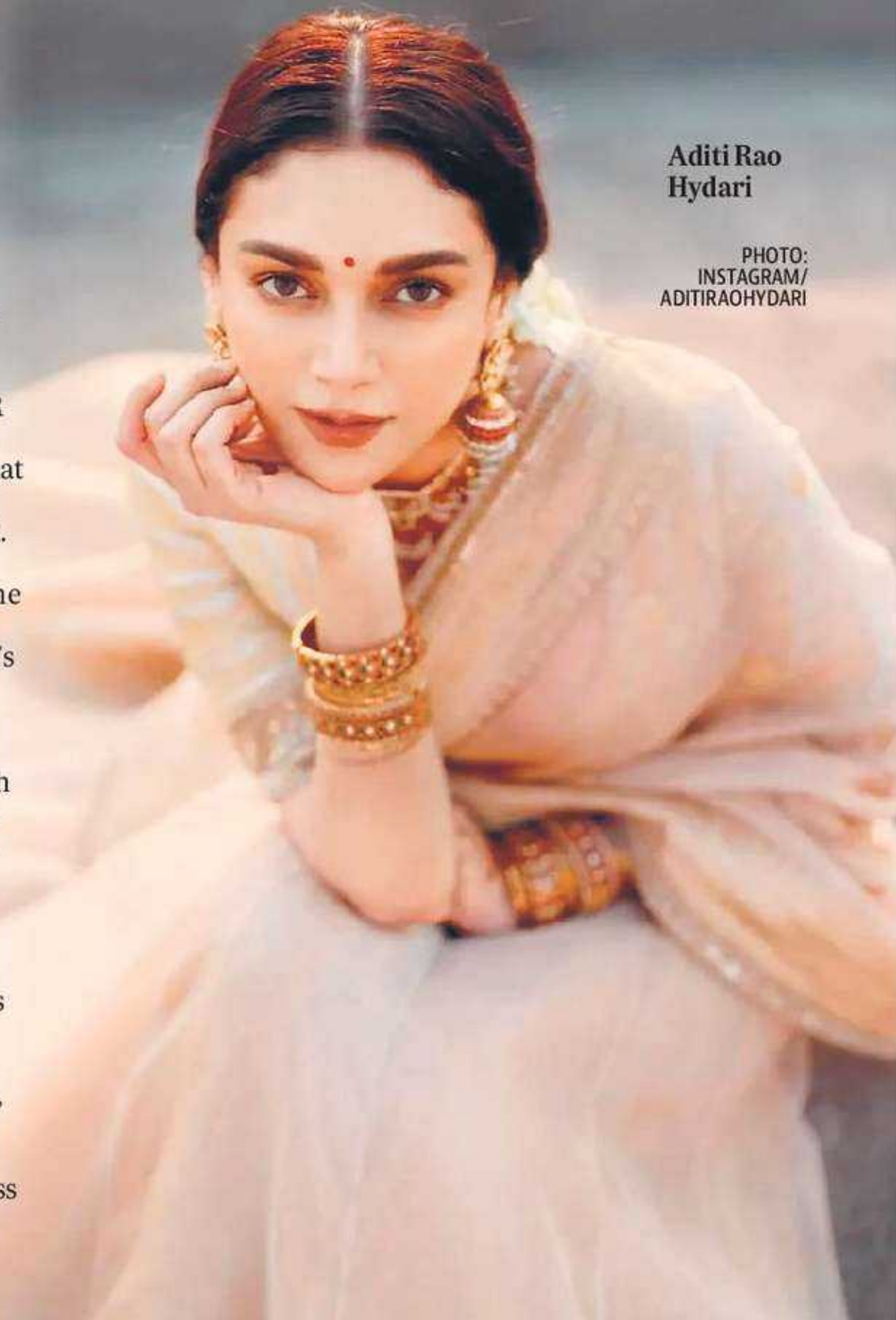

"A glowing or dewy base is a popular trend among brides which is inspired by the glass skincare trends from South Korea. Minimal colour with a shimmering finish is a big preference," shares Richa Agarwal, a beauty expert. She adds, "Eyes remain the focus for bridal makeup this year, with smoky glitter eyes being a viable option.

For, lip shades, nude or red shades are top choices."

OPT FOR A UNIFORM COLOUR PALETTE
Choosing the right makeup look that complements the bridal outfit and jewellery can be a challenging task. To perfect this, Agrawal suggests planning ahead: "Understanding the correct shades and tones is necessary. 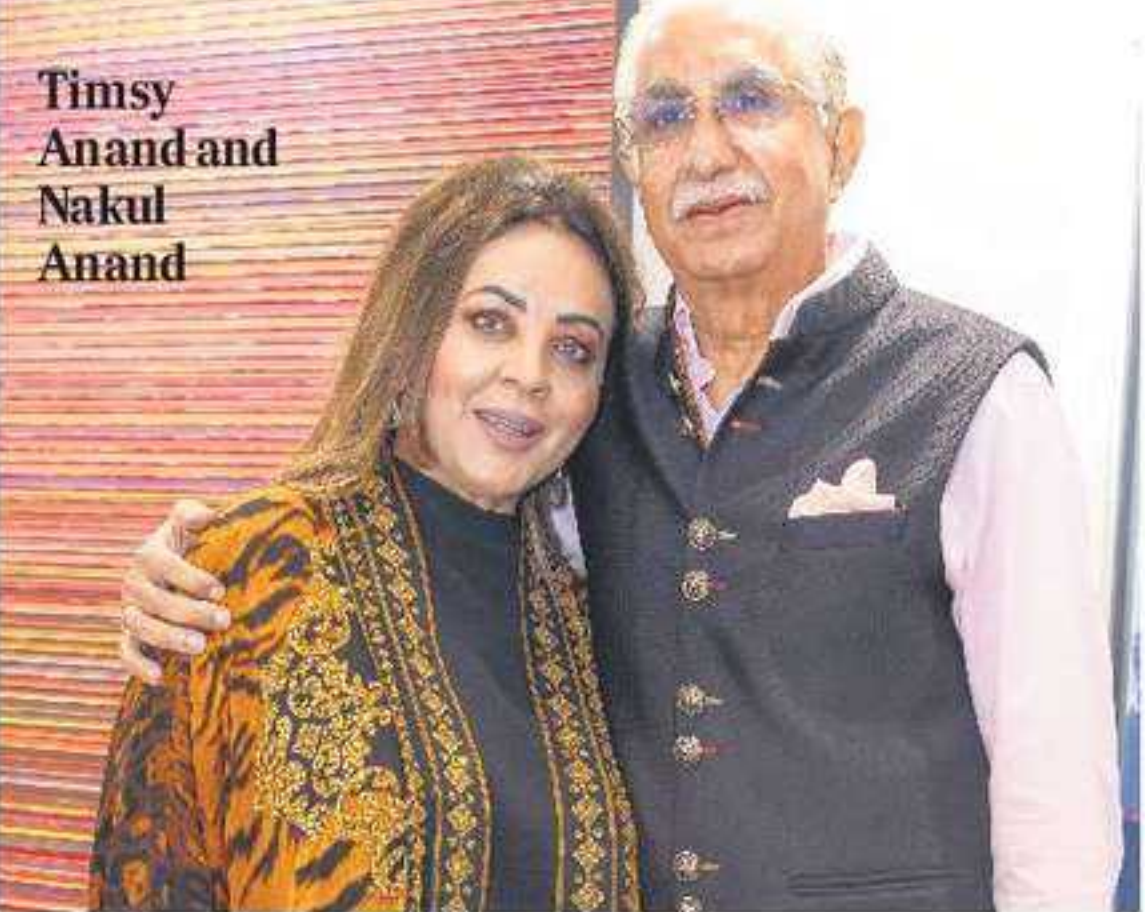

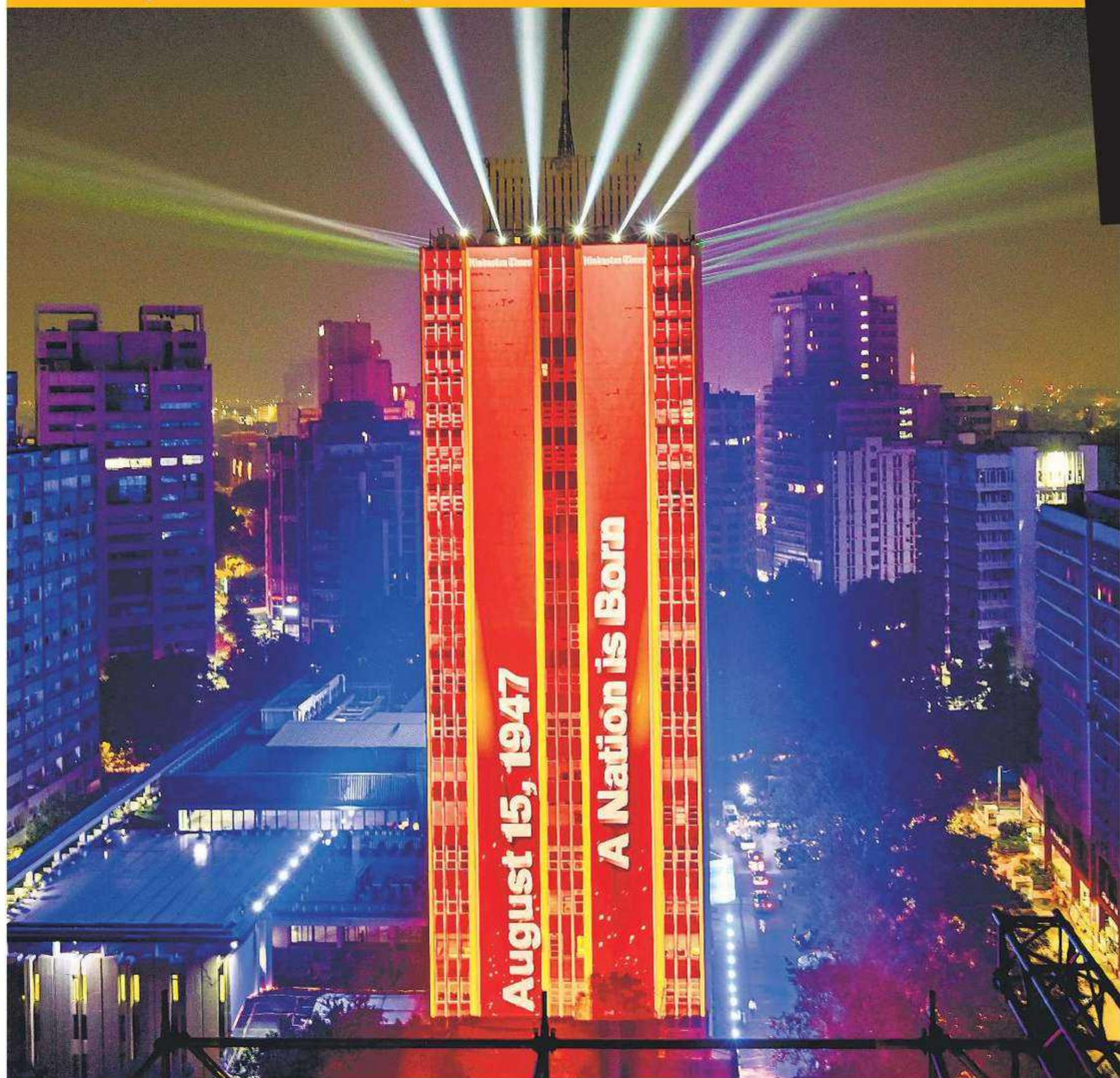

Under the lush green canopy of Kasturba Gandhi Marg, a crowd gathered on the evening of September 22, their gaze fixed upon the sky. The spectacle drawing their attention was none other than the iconic HT House, illuminated in all its glory to mark a century of Hindustan Times as the voice of the nation.

The street corner, usually a quiet spot where auto rickshaw drivers waiting for their next fare, was abuzz with excitement. Discussions about

the stunning display mingled with exclamations of awe. "Poori building pe TV lagaya hoga," one remarked, while another compared it to the grand lighting at Bharat Mandapam. Among them was one Mukesh Yadav, who told us, "Mujhe 27 saal ho gaye hain auto chalte hue, maine pehle kabhi aisa kuch nahin dekha."

Even passersby couldn't resist the urge to pull out their phones and record the moment. Nandita Sharma, a Jamia Millia Islamia student who was passing by, said, "It adds such character to the area." Muhammad Khalid Jamali, a banker who works in the nearby

Surya Kiran Building, shared, "When I stepped out of my office building, it felt like something big happened overnight. I've only got one word for it — majestic."

Saumya Sharma, a lawyer from the Indra Prakash Building, couldn't take her eyes off the display. She said, "We've been standing here for five minutes and I can't stop looking at it." Her friend, Sukriti Dwivedi, chimed in, "The way they've told the journey of India shows how far we have come as a country."

This spectacular visual narrative will light up HT House until September 28.
