

Unique challenge designed by citizens who love to explore the city on foot aims at mapping footpaths, rating them based on how obstacle-free they are and making B'luru friendlier to pedestrians

Focus on public transport good, but can more people walking also ease traffic?

itizens in Bengaluru face relentless traffic, with over 1 crore vehicles clogging the streets. Amid this chaos, pedestrians often go unnoticed, struggling with obstructed footpaths. According to MoveInSync, a city-based shuttle transport management company, over two-and-a-half lakh employees rely on shared transport daily, but even with efficient planning, commute times have increased by 10%, from 47 minutes pre-pandemic to 51 minutes now.

While efforts focus on public transport solutions like the Metro, buses, and cabs, Deepesh Agar, CEO of MoveInSync, and Arun Pai, Founder of Bengaluru Walks, highlight that walking could also ease traffic, if only the city's footpaths were obstacle-free.

Making footpaths walkable again

In response to this issue, Pai has taken an initiative to map pedestrian walkways of the city along with other stakeholders. He has launched a unique challenge: to create obstacle-free footpaths in the city. They have planned to map 100 kms of footpath to begin within the whole city. To bring attention to this issue, Pai introduced an interesting twist




to the challenge. "I've started running on footpaths," he says. "If I can run without looking down, it means the footpath is good. People need to see that it's possible to walk and even run safely."

Just 1 vet to care for 2,000 animals



Bannerghatta Biological Park reels under staff crunch; 20 posts of forest guards and watchers also vacant

he Bannerghatta Biological Park (BBP) currently has just one veterinarian to handle its more than 2,000 animals. Additionally, 20 posts of forest guards and forest watchers have remained vacant for the past five years.

As of March 2024, BBP has 1,623 mammals, 331 birds, and 221 reptiles. While the park has three sanctioned posts - Deputy Director Veterinary Science (DDVS), Assistant Director Veterinary Science (ADVS), and Veterinary Officer - for veterinary doctors, two are unoccupied.

"We currently have a VO, apart from a pathologist from the Institute of Animal Health & Veterinary Biologicals. We have one

Rising debate: Is renting or buying right for you?

Rental values increased more than property prices in Bengaluru, Pune, Kolkata & Chennai; many view rent as expense, EMIs as investment: Report

he debate between buying and renting a home continues to intensify as more people are migrating to cities like Bengaluru and weighing their options. While both choices have their pros and cons, the decision often depends on the location.

Rental values vs property prices

According to ANAROCK Research, rental values in key areas of Bengaluru and other major cities have surged by as much as 72% between the end of 2021 and the first half of 2024, while property prices (capital values) have grown at a slower pace.

Prashant Thakur, Regional Director & Head of Research at Anarock Group, explained that in cities like Bengaluru, Pune, Kolkata, and Chennai, rental values have increased more than property prices during this period. However, in cities like Delhi-NCR, Mumbai, and Hyderabad, capital values have grown faster than rental values. This data is a crucial factor though not the only one-in determining whether it's better to buy or rent a home. "In Bengaluru, Sarjapur Road saw average monthly rental values rise by 67%, while property prices increased by 54%. Similarly, at Thanisandra Main Road, rent-

als went up by 56%, and property values rose by 52%. Pune, Kolkata, and Chennai also experienced similar trends, where rental values grew faster than property prices in several areas," he said.

On the flip side, cities like Noida, Mumbai, and Hyderabad witnessed stronger capital value appreciation. For instance, in Noida's Sector-150, property prices surged by 127%, while rentals increased by 56%. In Hyderabad's Gachibowli, capital values shot up by 70%, outpacing rental growth of 50%. This data highlighted that while rising

rental values may make renting less attractive, other factors-like financial stability, job prospects, and personal preferences-play a key role in the decision-making process.

"For someone in Bengaluru

paying INR 50,000 per month in rent for a 2BHK worth INR 1.2 crore, continuing to rent over a decade would result in a rental expense of around INR 83 lakh, nearly 69% of the property's total cost without any return on investment," Thakur explained. He added that if that individual had chosen to buy the property with a home loan, they would build ownership over the same period, with EMI payments contributing towards owning a tangible asset.

Tenants' views on rent vs EMIs

Amid rising concerns about high-risk investments, many tenants are now viewing rent as an expense, while EMIs are seen as an investment in a stable asset. This sentiment grew stronger during the pandemic when homeownership became a safety net for many, and it continues to influence decisions today, he added.

Additionally, relatively low home loan interest rates, currently between 8.75% and 9.5%, are making homeownership more attractive. The report added that homebuyers also benefit from various tax deductions on loan repayments, stamp duty, and registration charges, with special incentives for women and first-time buyers. Ultimately, Thakur stressed that while financial calculations are important, personal preferences, market trends, and lifestyle priorities should guide the decision to buy or rent a home.

Empty bottles, no fences: After hours at Horamavu

Horamavu-Jayanthi Nagar Lake has become spot for miscreants and alcohol use, raising safety concerns among locals who urge police to intervene

oramavu-Jayanthi Nagar Lake, previously frequented by stray cattle, has now become a spot for individuals consuming alcohol. On Tuesday morning, residents from Horamavu and nearby areas who visited the lake for a walk were surprised to find several empty beer bottles on the lake bund. Residents and lake activists have repeatedly urged the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP) Lakes Department to fence the lake to keep stray cattle out. Now, visitors are concerned for their safety due to the presence of miscreants around the lake. "I was shocked to see empty beer bottles lying on the walking path of the lake. Lake Bund has become a convenient place for drunkards at night. With no security guard, the drunkards and miscreants have free access to the lake at night. We have complained to Ramamurthy Nagar Police but they suspect me as a drunkard complaining against other drunkards out of jealousy or enmity," said Nageswara Rao R, one of the lake volunteers.

He said he urges police to regularly visit the lake at night to keep the drunkards and miscreants away from the water body. "One of the gates donated by a philanthropist was stolen a few months ago but no action



was initiated by the authorities concerned. I appeal to the police to take all measures to ensure no drunkard enters the lake at night," he said.

Expressing concern over the misuse of the lake by drunkards at

night, Ayyappa Samy, a member of the Save Our Horamavu Lake Volunteers team, has said the BBMP Lakes Department has to expedite the fencing work and install the gate to prevent people from entering the lake at night. "It will be appreciated if the authorities concerned save and protect this lake from stray cattle and drunkards. I urge the police to visit the lake at night to keep the drunkards away from the lake," said Ayyappa Samy. A resident, pleading anonymity, said that he came across drunkards quarrelling among themselves. "There are chances of things getting out of hands at the lake if

the authorities fail to stop drunkards misusing the lake," the resident said.

Meanwhile, the Ramamurthy Nagar Police Inspector said that no one has complained about drunkards misusing the lake at night. "I will send policemen to the lake at night," said the Police Inspector. Bangalore Mirror published a story titled "1,200 saplings planted at lake land turn easy fodder" on September 16, narrating how the BBMP Forest Department planted saplings without tree guards at Horamavu-Jayanthi Nagar Lake which has no fence and gates to prevent stray cattle from entering the lake land.

BBMP rolls out faceless, contactless e-khata system

were surprised to receive text messages notifying them that Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP) officials would soon be visiting their homes to assist with the issuance of e-khata. The unexpected nature of the messages led to some scepticism about their authenticity. Later, BBMP Chief Commissioner Tushar Giri Nath confirmed the initiative, stating, "Following the guidance of Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar, BBMP is launching a faceless, contactless, and online digital e-khata issuance system. We have digitised all 21 lakh existing BBMP khatas, and the roll-out will commence shortly."

He further explained that as part of this initiative, BBMP staff will visit homes to record the GPS coordinates of each property in the coming days. This GPS data is essential for obtaining the BBMP e-khata, as it will serve as a unique identifier for each property. The accurate collection of this information is crucial for the seamless, contactless online delivery of BBMP e-khata services. Residents are encouraged to fully cooperate to ensure the successful implementation of this new system.

Explaining further, a BBMP official said that ekhata was currently being done at two wards on a pilot basis where the khata comes with the photo of the building as well as the khata holder. "Transitioning from handwritten khata to the new ekhata system marks a significant milestone for the Bangalore Bruhat Mahanagara Palike (BBMP) and The e-khata initiative reduces paper waste, supporting environmental sustainability

Firstly, the digitisation of khata records is a move towards greater accuracy and reduced errors. By implementing an ekhata system, we are significantly minimising these risks. The digital records ensure that data is uniformly captured and consistently updated, which enhances the accuracy and reliability of property documentation. Another key advantage of the e-khata system is its efficiency. In the past, property owners had to navigate through cumbersome paperwork and manual procedures to get their khata registered. This process was not only time-consuming but also prone to delays. With e-khata, property registration and updates can be completed online, vastly speeding up the process. This efficiency not only benefits property owners

by reducing their waiting time but also streamlines our internal operations, allowing us to serve the public more effectively."

BBMP officials said that the e-khata system promotes greater transparency and accessibility. "Digital records are easier to access and verify, which reduces the potential for fraudulent activities and unauthorised alterations. Property owners can now view and manage their khata details online, providing them with greater control and oversight. This transparency is crucial in building trust between the BBMP and the residents. The e-khata initiative also supports environmental sustainability. By reducing our reliance on paper-based records, we are contributing to a reduction in paper waste," added the BBMP official. — BMB

Fire breaks out at MS Ramaiah Hospital

3rd floor in flames due to 'short circuit'; patients evacuated

fire broke out at MS Ramaiah Memorial Hospital on Thursday, reportedly caused by a short circuit in an air conditioning unit. The blaze, which started around 1:25 pm, was promptly brought under control by the Fire Department. Firefighters who arrived shortly after the alarm was raised worked diligently to control the situation.

The fire originated on the third floor of the hospital, where significant damage was sustained. Swift action by the hospital staff and firefighters was crucial in preventing extensive harm.

According to sources, the fire was discovered in the early afternoon, triggering an immediate evacuation process. The hospital's intensive care unit (ICU), which housed seven cardiac patients, was promptly evacuated by the hospital staff. The staff's quick response ensured that all patients were safely relocated without any injuries.

Accidental fire in Devanahalli

Commercial goods worth crores of rupees were destroyed in a fire that broke out in a canter on Thursday in Devanahalli town, located in Bangalore Rural district. The vehicle, bearing registration number KA 43 6966, had arrived from Bengaluru, loaded with goods meant for deliv-



Fortunately, no one was inside the vehicle when the fire broke out, and there were no casualties reported.

The unfortunate incident occurred during the late night around 3:10 am, with the fire reducing all the items to ashes by morning. The fire brigade was alerted and rushed to the scene, managing to

extinguish the fire before it could spread further.

The fire was reportedly caused by a battery short circuit. Devanahalli police visited the scene and conducted a preliminary inspection of the burnt vehicle. The incident has caused significant loss to businesses expecting their goods to be delivered the next day.

Multiple cases filed against BJP MLA Muniratna, 6 others

First Information Report (FIR) was registered on Wednesday in Ramanagara district against BJP MLA Muniratna Naidu and six others, accusing them of rape, blackmail, and harassment. A 40-year-old complainant alleged that Muniratna repeatedly assaulted her and used threats to keep her silent. The complaint also implicates Vijay Kumar, Sudhakar, Kiran Kumar, Lohit Gowda, Manjunath, and Loki, who are accused of aiding in the crimes or facilitating the assaults.

Responding to this complaint of sexual assault and blackmail against Muniratna, Karnataka Home Minister G Parameshwar issued a statement affirming that the matter

would be handled with due legal process. "A complaint has been filed, and legal action will be taken based on the complaint. If public servants are found involved in such acts, action will be taken according to the law," he said.

The police officials at the Kaggalipura station have begun an investigation. The case has been registered under IPC Sections 354A (sexual harassment), 354C (voyeurism), 376 (sexual assault and rape), 506 (criminal intimidation), 504 (intentional insults), 120B (criminal conspiracy), 149 (unlawful assembly), 384 (extortion), 406 (criminal breach of trust), and 308 (attempt to commit culpable homicide).

Karnataka plans to strip Guv of chancellor's post

Groundwork laid at recent Cabinet meeting to amend State Universities Act, 2000

arnataka is now planning to follow the Kerala model by mulling to strip the Governor of chancellor's role. Amid rising tensions between the Karnataka government and the Governor, following the Governor's approval to prosecute Chief Minister Siddaramaiah in the alleged MUDA scam, the state government is now preparing to take another step in reducing the Governor's authority, this time concerning the appointment of university vice-chancellors. The government is looking to limit the Governor's role in these appointments, which historically falls under his purview.

During a recent Cabinet meeting held in Kalaburagi, the state government laid the groundwork for this move and has decided to bring an amendment to the Karnataka Universities Act, 2000, in the next legislative session. Currently, under the University Grants Commission (UGC) guidelines, the Governor acts as the Chancellor of all state universities and has significant powers, including the appointment of vicechancellors. While the Governor consults the Council of Ministers in university administrative matters, he can also make independent decisions. The state government is now seriously considering amending the law to clip the Governor's powers in this regard. An official said that after reviewing university laws from various states, the Karnataka government has decided to follow the Gujarat model, where the power to appoint vice-chancellors rests directly with the Chief Minister

instead of the Governor.

Draft nearing completion

The state government has formed a committee to draft amendments to the Karnataka Universities Act, 2000. According to sources, around 80% of the draft work has been completed, and the committee plans to submit the final draft to the government by the end of this month. The draft incorporates significant changes based on models from Gujarat, Tamil Nadu, and Andhra Pradesh, where the Chief Minister plays a direct role in the appointment of vice-chancellors. Karnataka's committee has proposed a similar system in the new draft law, which would grant the Chief Minister the authority to appoint vice-chancellors.

One year in the making

The Karnataka Universities Act was established in 2000 and has remained unchanged for 24 years. To modernise the law, the state government set up a committee in November 2023 with instructions to submit a report by December. While the committee has taken longer than expected, they are now in the final stages of preparing the report.

Will the Governor approve?

Once the committee submits the draft to the state government, it will be sent to the Law and Parliamentary Affairs Ministry for review before being presented to the Chief Minister. The bill is to be tabled in the next legislative ses-

sion. This bill would significantly reduce Governor's powers in university matters. The Minister of Higher Education Dr MC Sudhakar said, "We have discussed transferring the power to appoint vice-chancellors from the Governor to the Chief Minister. However, there is uncertainty about whether the Governor will approve the draft when it is sent to him for approval."

Current procedure

Under the current system, the government forms a search committee to recommend three qualified candidates for the post of vice-chancellor. This list is then sent to the Governor's office, where the Governor, in consultation with the government, selects one candidate. The Governor has the final say in appointing vice-chancellors.

Campus fair boosts local artisans

the students from final year Master of Arts in Advertising and Public Relations (APR), School of Communication and Media Studies (SCMS) at St Joseph's University, organised 'Artisans for Impact', a campus fair aimed at promoting small businesses across Bengaluru. Held on Wednesday from 9 am to 5 pm, the fair showcased a diverse range of handmade goods, including jute bags, candles, posters, and food items like spices, baked goods, ragi mudde, and jolada rotti. The event witnessed a vibrant footfall of around 4,000 to 5,000 students from the university.

According to Rehan, a final-year APR student, the inspiration for this initiative came from their rural exposure outreach camp experience in Manvi, Raichur, where they encountered villagers running small businesses, creating handmade products like jute bags, earrings, etc.

Determined to support these businesses, the students expanded their scope to include eight NGOs across Bengaluru. These included local artisans, some reportedly with physical or intellectual disabilities, who create various handmade products such as bags, bookmarks, candles, posters, food items and chocolates.

"The villagers from Manvi had a successful day, selling more than 200 jute bags, spices, earrings, and jolada rottis. The NGOs expressed their gratitude and eagerness to participate in future events organised by the university. The event successfully garnered sponsorships from local businesses, enabling us to provide transportation to the villagers and gain support for the great success of the fair. All the proceeds from the sales went directly to the villagers and NGOs, with no expenses incurred by them," said Rehan.

The entire staff commended the students for their initiative. "The finance officer even purchased all 200 remaining jute bags on behalf of the university, intending to use them as mementos with the university's logo," added Rehan.

The challenge, which began on September 15, on the birth anniversary of Sir M Visvesvaraya, a great engineer and avid walker, aims to be completed by October 2, Gandhi Jayanti, another inspiration dedicated to a famous walker.

Pai and Agar began by focusing on areas where a lot of people work, including Whitefield, HSR Layout, Koramangala, and MG Road. Their goal is to assess the state of the footpaths in these locations, starting with the heart of the city where government offices are concentrated. "We walked through areas where the footpaths are wider," Pai explains. "For example, the footpaths from MG Road to Old HAL Road are mostly in decent shape. People can walk side by side, and in some sections, you could even run."

However, Agar highlights that the second part of Old HAL Road is a different story. "Every 200 metres, there are obstructions, broken footpaths, fallen trees, and construction work blocking the way. These issues make

walking unpleasant, but the good news is that these obstacles can be fixed."

Shape of footpaths

Not all of Bengaluru's footpaths can be repaired so easily but there are many problems that can be solved. Agar is less optimistic about the Outer Ring Road, where around 8 lakh people work in tech parks and offices. "I'm not sure what we'll find there, but I'm not hopeful," he admits.

At some spots in the city, footpaths are caved in because the tiles used in their construction have sunk or cracked. Others are blocked by trees that haven't been maintained or by ongoing construction projects that spill over into pedestrian spaces. In some areas, people simply haven't bothered to fix the footpaths because they're not frequently used.

"Construction sites often take over footpaths," Agar explains. "In commercial or military areas, the footpaths are barricaded, and basic care is ignored. If more people used footpaths, they would automatically get more attention."

Clement Jayakumar, Secretory Task force, Mahadevapura said walkability was a crucial factor in mobility and the adoption of public transport. "In Mahadevapura, we're working to improve walkability, particularly around the extended Purple Line. Key obstacles include drainage slabs, originally designed for pedestrians but damaged by vehicles, the increasing issue of optical fibre cables, overgrown tree branches, footpath encroachment, stray dogs, and insufficient street lighting. Addressing these challenges is essential for making our city more walkable."

Pai, who has been leading walks around Bengaluru for 20 years, says footpaths are crucial for showcasing the city's heritage. "They also reflect the city's reputation. Many people don't walk because they think it's impossible, but I walk everywhere. What we've discovered is that people have strong opinions and they complain about narrow or encroached footpaths, but there are still those who have to walk."

For example, if you take the metro or bus, you are likely to walk to your destination. "Despite the challenges, many people in Bengaluru are pedestrians, but their needs often go unheard. Our society tends to focus on people in cars, but we rarely consider the issues faced by pedestrians."

Rate footpaths

Pai also plans to take inspiration from rating systems used by platforms like Zomato and Ola. "If people can rate restaurants without being food experts, why can't they rate footpaths?" he asks. His idea is to develop an app where citizens can rate footpaths on a scale of 1 to 5. This user-generated data

could then help the authorities prioritise repairs. "We want citizens to rate the footpaths," hesays. "If a footpath is damaged or blocked, users can upload photos and details through the app. Someone who has the power to fix the problem could step in. That's the potential of this platform."

End goal

Pai says that if footpaths are improved, more people will start walking, which could indirectly reduce traffic. However, some problems are more complex. For example, the high dividers on roads often force pedestrians to walk long distances to find a crossing point. Illegal parking on footpaths is another issue, although pedestrians still tend to navigate around parked vehicles rather than giving up on walking entirely.

Street vendors, too, are part of the footpath ecosystem. "We don't mind street vendors," Arun says. "In fact, they add character to the walk. As long as they leave enough space for people to walk safely, they're not the problem."

HC judge refers to part of B'luru as Pakistan

Remark made while listening to case involving crowded auto creates furore



Karnataka High Court judge Justice V Srishananda has sparked controversy on social media after referring to a Muslim-dominated area in Bengaluru as 'Pakistan' during a hearing related to insurance. The judge made the comment while discussing the Gori Palya area in West Bengaluru, stating, "Go to that Mysuru Road flyover. Every auto rickshaw has got 10 people. It is not applicable because the Mysore flyover right up to the flower market from Gori Palya is in Pakistan, not in India. This is the reality. This is the reality. No matter how strict a police officer you put there, they will be beaten up there."

The remarks were made during a hearing on August 28 concerning the Rent Control Act, specifically discussing a lease agreement and the powers of a land owner under Section 27 (2)(o) of the Act. The Court also discussed potential amendments needed in various laws, including the Rent Control Act and the Motor Vehicles Act.

Justice Srishananda emphasised the importance of lane discipline and speed limits, drawing comparisons to "foreign countries" where vehicles must adhere to strict rules. He pointed out the lack of discipline among heavily loaded KSRTC and private buses sharing the same lane, which an advocate described as "a disaster waiting to happen".

The judge further criticised the lack of action taken by school principals and parents regarding students riding scooters and auto rickshaws carrying excessive numbers of students, even after a tragic incident involving a van capsising and the death of three children. He expressed concern over the inactivity of the police and their alleged involvement in lobbying, suggesting that the majority of these schools are run by influential individuals who can manage the situation.

No stay on defamation case

The High Court expressed its displeasure on Thursday regarding a statement made by

BJP MLA Basangouda Patil Yatnal, in which he referred to Dinesh Gundu Rao, the State Minister for Health and Family Welfare, as "half Pakistani".

Justice M Nagaprasanna, presiding over a single judge bench, declined to stay the defamation proceedings initiated against Yatnal by Rao's wife, Tabbasum Dinesh Rao, under Sections 499 and 500 of the Indian Penal Code. The court remarked, "The statement straightaway attracts the provisions and this is why defamation cases are on the rise."

Addressing Yatnal's counsel, the judge orally questioned the necessity of making such statements, emphasising that one cannot label a particular community in such a manner, as they are part of the country. The court stressed

that this is not an appropriate way to express oneself.

Yatnal's counsel, Venkatesh Dalwai, argued that the statement was made in response to a public statement by the Minister. However, Rao's wife claims that the statement was directed at her. The court then observed that mudslinging serves no purpose and that dubbing someone as "half Pakistani" simply because their wife is Muslim is incorrect and unacceptable.

Dalwai claimed that the magistrate court did not follow proper procedure while taking cognizance of the complaint, as no notice was issued to Yatnal. The court agreed with this contention and stated that it would direct the Magistrate to redo the exercise of cognizance, as the accused must be heard after issuing notice under the BNSS (Bharat Nirmaan Sena Samiti).

No criminal proceedings against Karandlaje

The High Court has dismissed the criminal proceedings against Shobha Karandlaje, a Member of Parliament, in connection with her statement made during a protest in Bengaluru. The BJP MP had linked the suspect in the Rameshwaram cafe blast with Tamil Nadu. Justice M Nagaprasanna, in his singlejudge bench ruling, quashed the case registered at the Cottonpet Police station under sections of the Representation of People Act. The court referred to a recent order by the Madras High Court, which had also quashed similar proceedings against Karandlaje based on the same incident.

Eviction fear near Palike Bazaar

treet vendors have expressed their protest against the city's first underground market, Sri Krishnadevaraya Palike Bazaar, near the Vijayanagar metro station, that was recently inaugurated by the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP).

In the service road where the Palike Bazaar is situated, over 150 street vendors would carry out their business. Now officials, without following any process, have


allocated a few shops to some traders and are moving to evict the street vendors who continue to sell on the street.

Street vendors have noted that the eviction is violative of the Street Vendors Act 2014 as they have not been provided with any notice as required under section 18 of the act.

Additionally, vendors of Vijayanagar had obtained a stay on eviction by BBMP (S Babu and others vs BBMP and others). — BMB

BSY plea hearing adjourned

arnataka High Court on Thursday adjourned the hearing of former Karnataka Chief Minister BS Yediyurappa's plea seeking to quash a case against him for the alleged harassment of a minor to September 27. more veterinarian on an additional charge from Bannerghatta National Park. However, our veterinarians also need to attend rescue calls. Thus, there is a need to hire one or two more as soon as possible," said AV Surya Sen, deputy conservator of forest, BBP.

In 2019, 20 posts of forest guards and watchers were created at BBP under the Cadre and Recruitment rule. However, officials say these posts, which are necessary for better

management of animals at the park and smooth functioning of the system, never got occupied. Officials say the roles were created to act as intermediaries between range officers and animal keepers for efficient management of the park and better upkeep of its animals.

In recent times, highly educated applicants - PhD holders, engineers, and those with master's degreeshave applied for the posts of forest guards and watchers advertised by the Karnataka Forest Department (KFD).

Overseer needed

"BBP has different sections such as safari, Butterfly Park, rescue center, zoo, hospital, etc and each section requires special attention. If the animal keepers have to be managed efficiently and monitored well, there is a need for an intermediary between range officers and animal keepers. This is the reason vacancies for forest guards and watchers were created. These guards can help us in managing animal keepers and overseeing activities such as if animals are fed on time, food that they are getting and



timely reporting of a sick animal," said an official.

BBP says it has written to the forest department highlighting vacant

posts of forest guards and watchers, requesting the department to fill the vacancies.

"We have written to the department to fill these vacancies. While the department is conducting counseling for the posts of guards and watchers, preference is given to field postings, where there already are a lot of vacancies. While overall staff strength is good and we are outsourcing human resources wherever needed and possible, we need to conduct some recruitment from our side," said the official.

'K'taka has protected 16,114 sq km of Ghats'

Experts suggest state does more as Forest Minister holds meeting on Kasturirangan report

arnataka Forest Minister Eshwar B Khandre said that Karnataka has already protected 16,114 sq km of eco-sensitive area across its 11 districts in Western Ghats and this is an appropriate limit.

The minister said this on Thursday after meeting with district in-charge ministers and MLAs of the districts on the implementation of the K Kasturirangan report.

The consultations with political leaders were organised in the wake of the Ministry of Environment, Forest, and Climate Change (MoEF&CC) issuing the sixth draft notification of the report over a month ago. The meeting was held today to seek the views of the ministers and MLAs.

The state government has notified and protected over 16K sq km in various forms such as national parks, sanctuaries, and ESZ.

"Kasturirangan report may be



Western Ghats spanning across 11 districts in state already protected

accepted subject to this limit as 16,114 sq km of eco-sensitive area around various forest and wildlife sites in the state has already been protected. Many stakeholders present in the meeting today are of the view that if the area is increased further, the lives of people on forest fringes will become difficult. If we implement the Kasturirangan report, buffer zone around protected areas will be reduced to zero," said Khandre.

All the views taken on Thursday will be discussed in the cabinet subcommittee meeting and with the chief minister, later to be submitted to the Centre

The Kasturirangan Committee report has identified an eco-sensitive zone of 20,668 sq km in the state. The district in-charge ministers and MLAs that attended the meeting on Thursday believe that if a physical survey is conducted, the area will increase further.

"It is not advisable to evict people who have been living inside forests for generations. All these issues will be

discussed in tomorrow's meeting," the Minister said.

Special package

Khandre suggested that the Centre should provide a special package to the state for declaring parts of Western Ghat as eco-sensitive areas. "Even if the area of 16,114 sq km is approved, the livelihood of people living in 1,576 villages in the region will be affected. The Ghats region is the source of water for many rivers and monsoon rain. Therefore, the responsibility of protecting it lies with the Centre," said Khandre.

Experts demand full implementation

Ecologists and conservationists say the government should consider implementing the K Kasturirangan report in its entirety as the biodiversity hotspot is under serious threat, making it crucial to get the area notified as an ecologically sensitive Area (ESA). The draft notification issued on July 31 includes 20,668 sq km of the Western Ghats in Karnataka and has suggested a complete ban on com-

mercial activities such as sand mining, quarrying, and mining. Conservationists working at grassroots levels in districts of Western Ghat in Karnataka say locals have been opposing the Kasturirangan report due to misinformation spread by politicians for vested interest.

Activists say the government should constitute district-level and state-level committees to disseminate information. "Villagers in these 11 districts need to be educated about the two reports. The existing misconception can be dispelled only by mass awareness. The reports should also be made available in vernacular language. Public consultations in coordination with line departments should be conducted," said Giridhar Kulkarni, a wildlife conservationist.

"All the reports on the fragile status of Western Ghats - K Kasturirangan, Madhav Gadgil, and IISc's report- are scientific. Good governance ensures the conservation of natural resources and sustainability," said Dr TV Ramachandra, Center for Ecological Sciences, Indian Institute of Science (IISc).
