Oman's labour market sees 6.4% growth in 2023, says report

MUSCAT: Oman's labour market is witnessing significant transformation as part of the country's Vision 2040 implementation efforts. According to the Oman Vision 2040 Implementation and Follow-up Unit's annual report issued recently, more than 853,000 Omanis were employed across the public and private sectors in 2023, marking a 6.4 percent growth from the previous year. Expatriates also accounted for 1.8 million workers, with a 7% increase. These figures highlight the impact of ongoing reforms and strategic initiatives aimed at boosting national workforce participation and aligning the labour market with the country's long-term economic goals.

Key labour reforms and initiatives have positioned the country for continued success, making the labour market more attractive to national talent and addressing the evolving needs of the private sector. Central to these reforms was the issuance of the new Labour Law in accordance with Royal Decree No. 53/2023, aimed at improving worker conditions, enhancing productivity, and fostering long-term stability in the labour market. **Strategic employment initiatives in 2023** A major highlight of 2023 was the launch of the labour market needs survey in private sector establishments. **>A6**

The foreign minister held several meetings with a number of officials, on the sidelines of the 79th General Assembly of the United Nations

NEW YORK: Sayyid Badr bin Hamad Al Busaidi, Foreign Minister conveyed message of His Majesty Sultan Haitham bin Tarik, along with the Sultanate of Oman's greetings to Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah and the people of Brunei Darussalam on the occasion of the 40th anniversary of Brunei joining the United Nations.

This came during a ceremony held under the patronage of Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah of Brunei Darussalam, within the context of the 79th General Assembly of the United Nations.

Meanwhile, Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah asked Sayyid Badr to convey his greetings and best wishes to His Majesty the Sultan and the people of Oman. He also wished relations between Oman and Brunei Darussalam further progress and prosperity.

On other side, Sayyid Badr bin Hamad Al Busaidi, Foreign Minister held several meetings with a number of officials, on the sidelines of the 79th General Assembly of the United Nations.

Sayyid Badr held a meeting with Gabrielius Landsbergis, Foreign Minister of the Republic of Lithuania.

The two ministers reviewed relations of friendship and joint projects, as well as the efforts exerted to expand areas of partnership in the economic, cultural, scientific and technological fields. They also exchanged views on a set of current regional and international issues.

Sayyid Badr also held a meeting with Luminita Odobescu, Foreign Minister of Romania. They discussed means of enhancing relations between Oman and Romania. They also explored areas of cooperation in the fields of economy, culture and education.

The two ministers touched on the regional and international issues of mutual interests. They expressed their joint support for the efforts exerted to maintain regional and international peace and



stability. They also laid emphasis on the importance of dialogue and peaceful means in addressing security challenges.

Sayyid Badr also held a meeting with Philippe Lazzarini, Commissioner-General of the United Na-

tions Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees (UNRWA).

The two sides discussed the humanitarian challenges facing the Palestinian refugees.

Sayyid Badr expressed the Sultanate of Oman's continued sup-

port for efforts aimed at improving the conditions of refugees. He underlined the importance of collective action and demanding the implementation of UN resolutions calling for the entry of urgent humanitarian aid into the Gaza

Strip without any obstacles. Sayyid Badr valued the UNRWA's efforts in providing vital assistance and basic services to Palestinian refugees.

In his turn, the Commissioner-General of UNRWA lauded the ac-

During his meeting with Abdulaziz Ibrahim Al-Mulla, Executive Director of the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development, Sayyid Badr discussed cooperation and partnership relations between the Sultanate of Oman and the World Bank and ways to develop a number of financial and technical cooperation and economic diversification programs, including capacity building programs that support development and sustainability. -ONA

MOSQUITO CONTROL

Team from Muscat Municipality reviews mosquito eradication plan

MUSCAT: The team tasked with dealing and supervising the investigation and control of the Aedes mosquito in Muscat Governorate met on Wednesday under the chairmanship of Ahmed Mohammed Al Humaidi, Chairman of Muscat Municipality.

The meeting reviewed the results of the executive plan for the Aedes mosquito control work for the year 2023-2024, and the future plan for 2024-2025, while specialists from the Ministry of Health reviewed the indicators of the epidemiological situation.

The results of the executive plan for the past year 2023-2024 showed a decrease in the number of dengue fever infections by nearly 93% compared to the previous season.



The team visited 69,000 homes and facilities with the aim of eliminating the breeding grounds of the Aedes mosquito; which contributed to reducing its density. The number of fixed swamps

(which are breeding grounds for mosquitoes) in the wilayats of Muscat Governorate was also limited to 266 sites with an area of 84 square kilometres, and the data of these sites was updated on the interactive map with the aim of

creating a database and organising vector control work.

The plan witnessed the implementation of electronic transformation in entering data on combating work through the use of a special programme on mobile phones.

Muscat Municipality, represented by the General Directorate of Health Affairs and Municipalities in the wilayats, seeks to limit the spread of all types of mosquitoes, especially the Aedes mosquito, through teams qualified with all technical requirements and modern methods, and emphasises its efforts in preserving public health through its systematic work and strategic plans. -ONA

Pact to establish Oman as leader in low-carbon fuels for bunkering

MUSCAT: Asyad Group, in collaboration with OQ Alternative Energy and Sumitomo Corporation Middle East FZE, announced a joint study agreement to explore the potential of establishing Oman as a global leader in low-carbon fuels for bunkering.

This visionary initiative represents a pioneering step in promoting sustainable shipping practices to meet global decarbonization goals in the maritime industry and leveraging Oman's renewable resources on a global scale.

The group has issued a Request For Information (RFI) to the world's leading shipping companies to drive the adoption of global green logistic solutions in Oman.

Additionally, a feasibility study

will be conducted to assess key factors including the levelized costs of delivered low-carbon fuels, the infrastructure required to support such operations, and the alignment with global regulatory standards for sustainable fuels.

Early findings suggest that Oman's unique geographical advantage and superior renewable energy resources could position the country as a frontrunner in providing competitively priced low-carbon fuels to the global shipping industry.

The insights derived from the RFI will represent the cornerstone for the study and will be crucial in guiding the development of a world-class low-carbon bunkering infrastructure in Oman, thus making a lasting impact on global

maritime practices.

In line with Oman's Vision 2040 and its sustainable energy strategy, the parties aim to leverage the Sultanate of Oman's abundant renewable resources to offer low-carbon fuels such as e-methanol and ammonia at competitive prices.

Current bunkering facilities at the Ports of Salalah and Duqm are earmarked as strategic sites for potential retrofitting to support low-carbon fuel operations. By updating these existing infrastructures and transforming these ports into key nodes on vital global trade routes, Oman aims to become a leader in the global transition to low-carbon shipping fuels and further support the growth of the nation's burgeoning logistics sector. -ONA

He explained that the media can bridge gaps, furnish common areas among nations and encourage them to better communicate with each other.

Spreading awareness

The Egyptian official also spoke about the role of the media in handling the technology revolution that stems from communication, noting that "media content should

He added that this challenge is after all global rather than being associated with specific countries. Yet, he affirmed that the print press would continue to be part of the soft power of societies. — ONA

President Biden, Prof Yunus affirm close partnership between Dhaka, Washington



NEW YORK: Chief Advisor to the Bangladesh interim government, Muhammad Yunus, met US President Joe Biden on Tuesday, on the sidelines of the 79th United Nations General Assembly.

President Biden congratulated Yunus on his recent appointment as the head of the interim government.

The two leaders affirmed the "close partnership" between the United States and Bangladesh, which is rooted in shared democratic values and strong people-to-people ties, the White House statement read.

President Biden welcomed further engagement between the two governments and offered continued US support as Bangladesh implements its new reform agenda.

The press release from the Bangladesh side, stated that President Biden expressed US government's "full support" to Bangladesh and the Professor Yunus-led Interim Government during the meeting.

"President Biden expressed US government's full support for Chief Adviser Dr. Muhammad Yunus and his government as they met on the margin of the UNGA," Yunus said in a post in X.

Yunus also apprised Biden on the situation in Bangladesh. He also spoke about how the students rose against the "tyranny of the previous government" and gave their lives in order to rebuild Bangladesh.

The chief advisor further stressed the need for the US's cooperation for him to succeed his government in rebuilding the country.

The Chief Advisor also handed a copy of the book 'The Art of Triumph' to President Biden, which depicts the wall paintings drawn by the students during the uprising.

This is the first time in the history of Bangladesh that a US President has met a head of the Bangladesh government on the sidelines of the UNGA, according to the press release by the Bangladesh side.

Meanwhile, Muhammad Yunus also met Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau on the sidelines of the UN general assembly meeting on Tuesday.

During the brief meeting, the two leaders discussed ways to cement Bangladesh-Canada relationships, deepen freedom, build institutions, and support the youth of Bangladesh, the release stated.

Trudeau appreciated Professor Yunus for assuming the responsibility and expressed Canada's readiness to support institution building in Bangladesh.

Professor Yunus handed The Art of Triumph, an art book of the wall paintings by the students and young people drawn during and after the Revolution, to the Canadian prime minister.

He also requested Canada grant more visas to Bangladeshi students. — ANI

FROM A1 Marsad platform provides decision-makers details about labour market data

This project, designed to align workforce development with actual market requirements, plays a crucial role in ensuring Oman's workforce is equipped to meet future job demands.

Furthermore, the issuance of 707,000 work permits and the registration of 634,000 work contracts for both Omanis and expatriates reflected the robust nature of the labour market.

The Ministry of Labour's commitment to improving working conditions was evident through 1,281 inspection visits conducted to ensure compliance with Occupational Safety and Health Regulations.

A notable achievement in 2023 was the establishment of sectoral skills units for Fisheries, Engineering, and Information Technology.

These units serve as platforms where employers, industry leaders, and academia collaborate to develop workforce skills aligned with international standards.

The National Employment Policy project, which launched in 2023, further reinforces these goals by focusing on identifying labour market needs and bridging

the gap between education outcomes and employment demands.

Among the Ministry of Labour's future plans are four major programmes designed to improve labour market conditions and boost employment opportunities.

These programmes include the completion of the National Employment Policy Project, now 55% complete, the National Strategy for Professional Standards at 49%, the Labour Market Policies Development and Enhancement Project at 65%, and the Training Project coupled with Replacement, which aims to create 11,000 new training opportunities.

In 2023, the Ministry of Labour took decisive steps to implement several initiatives that have already had a positive impact on the employment system. Two notable initiatives focused on enhancing job opportunities in both the private and public sectors.

As a result, 13,242 job seekers were appointed in private sector establishments for the first time, while 29,668 individuals were re-appointed through job rotation initiatives. Furthermore, 17,910 job seekers secured positions within public sector establishments,

demonstrating the government's commitment to creating sustainable employment for Omanis across various industries.

Marsad platform: Enhancing data-driven employment planning

An integral part of Oman's strategy for improving labour market indicators is the Marsad platform, which, while not reformed in 2023, continues to play a vital role in facilitating the employment of Omani youth in both public and private sectors.

The platform provides decision-makers with detailed labour market data, including information on job seekers and students in various educational institutions. This data enables more harmonious planning between educational outcomes and the labour market's actual needs, bridging the gap between skills and job opportunities.

Marsad contains six dashboards designed to measure key indicators, including population census data, labor force metrics, active and inactive job seekers, and education and graduate statistics. This robust data infrastructure is essential for Oman's ongoing ef-

forts to align higher education and vocational training with market demands, further ensuring that the national workforce is prepared for future job opportunities.

Skills development and training

To further boost the national workforce's capabilities, Oman placed significant emphasis on training programmes.

In 2023, 9,300 young Omani cadres underwent various training initiatives, helping them acquire the skills needed for emerging job opportunities. These training efforts, along with Oman's focus on improving professional standards, aim to close the gap between education and employment, ensuring the workforce remains competitive both locally and internationally.

A significant initiative in this area includes an agreement between the Ministry of Labour and the Musleh platform, which trained 600 job seekers in various maintenance fields. Additionally, over 2,000 Omani men and women were trained as part of a programme to support entrepreneurs and promote self-employment.

The job security fund: A safety net for workers

Oman has also implemented the Job Security Fund, a key element in ensuring stability for Omani workers who face job loss due to circumstances beyond their control, such as arbitrary dismissal. By the end of 2023, the fund had benefited over 17,000 individuals, including 13,599 whose services were terminated and 3,400 whose contracts had expired, offering temporary financial relief while they sought alternative employment.

Legislative reforms driving stability and growth

The issuance of the new Labour Law represents a key milestone in the country's labour market development. This comprehensive legal framework addresses the modern needs of the economy by enhancing productivity, improving operating conditions, and increasing job stability in both public and private sector establishments.

The law also aims to reduce disruptions in the labour market by preventing strikes and closures, ensuring businesses and workers can operate in a stable and predict-

able environment.

It further contributes to Omanisation efforts, promoting higher rates of Omani participation in technical, professional, and administrative roles across industries.

Future-oriented strategies

With Oman's labour market growing rapidly, the Ministry of Labour continues to focus on long-term strategies that prioritise skills development, job creation, and regulatory improvements.

By fostering a balanced and competitive employment landscape, Oman is steadily moving toward achieving its Vision 2040 goals, where both Omani talent and expatriate contributions are essential to the nation's prosperity.

UNRWA warns of generation loss in Gaza under Israeli aggression

GAZA: Commissioner-General of the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA) Philippe Lazzarini warned of the ongoing violations of international humanitarian law in the Gaza Strip, worsening daily in light of the continuing Israeli occupation aggression.

According to the UN News website, Lazzarini said that more than 600,000 children in Gaza are living in the rubble and suffering from deep trauma, warning that the delay in returning them to a suitable educational environment threatens the loss of an entire generation, which could lead to the strengthening of feelings of hatred and resentment.

Lazzarini addressed the deteriorating situation of schools and infrastructure in Gaza, where more

than 70 percent of UNRWA facilities were fully destroyed or damaged, highlighting that the agency has faced ongoing targeting, including the killing of more than 220 staff since Oct. 7, 2023.

Humanitarian relief operations are being hampered despite prior coordination with the relevant parties.

In a related context, the UNRWA Commissioner-General spoke about the successful polio vaccination campaign, which managed to protect more than 640,000 children under the age of ten, amid concerns about the return of the disease 25 years after its eradication.

Regarding the occupied West Bank, Lazzarini described the sit-

uation as a "silent war" boiling in the West Bank as a result of what is happening in Gaza and Lebanon, where the residents of the West Bank are suffering from increasing violations by the occupation forces and settlers.

He also pointed to the escalating tensions on the Blue Line between Lebanon and the occupied Palestinian territories, warning that Lebanon could become a "new Gaza" if urgent efforts are not taken to prevent the escalating Israeli aggression against Lebanon.

Regarding the agency's funding, Lazzarini affirmed that UNRWA is facing a worsening financial crisis and that the needs have never been as great as they are today, expressing his concern about reducing

contributions from member states in 2025 when the Palestinians need more support.

The UN official called for a ceasefire, the release of hostages, and increased humanitarian aid, stressing that political solutions are clear, but the region needs political will to achieve this.

UN Rapporteur calls for protection of healthcare workers in Palestine

UN Special Rapporteur on the right to health Tlaleng Mofokeng called for the protection of healthcare workers in the Gaza Strip and the occupied Palestinian territory.

"On the cusp of the one-year anniversary of the genocide, I continue to be shocked at Israel's blatant

disregard for the right to health in Gaza and the rest of the occupied territory," Mofokeng said. "Israel must stop destroying and hindering the already limited functioning of the health system in Palestine, by protecting healthcare workers," she said.

"The practice of medicine is never a crime during conflict but targeted killing of healthcare workers is," She added. "Israel must stop." The Special Rapporteur said the targeting of healthcare workers and healthcare facilities contravenes the fundamental right of individuals to access essential healthcare services, a matter of acute significance during times of conflict, and may constitute a war crime.

Mofokeng demanded the immediate release of all healthcare workers arbitrarily detained in occupation and the occupied Palestinian territory, and urgent, independent and impartial investigations, and accountability for those who have unlawfully detained and killed them.

"A people's inability to fully exercise their right to self-determination impacts the enjoyment of all their fundamental rights, including the right to health," Mofokeng said. "Immediately ceasefire. End the occupation. End the genocide," she said.

Over 10,900 Palestinians detained in occupied West Bank since October 7, says prisoners institutions

The Israeli occupation forces detained at least 20 people, including former detainees, in the occupied West Bank during the last 24 hours.

The Detainees and Ex-Detainees Commission and the Palestine Prisoners Society said in a joint statement that the detention operations took place across different governorates in the occupied West Bank, accompanied by widespread raids and abuse, assaults and threats against detainees and their families, in addition to vandalism and destruction of citizens' homes.

PPS and the Commission affirmed that, the total number of Palestinians detained in the occupied West Bank since October 7th has risen to over 10,900. This figure includes those detained from their homes, at military checkpoints, those who surrendered under pressure, and those taken hostage.

Several civilians killed and others injured in Israeli airstrikes on different areas in Gaza

Several civilians were killed and others were injured on Wednesday after Israeli occupation warplanes targeted large areas in the Gaza Strip.

Civil Defence sources reported that their crews recovered the body of an elderly man, 70, and a young man who were killed after the occupation targeted a group of citizens in the Khirbet al-Adas area north of Rafah in the southern Gaza Strip.

The defence crews also recovered the body of a girl from under the rubble of her house that was destroyed by the occupation yesterday in the Al-Ahly Club area in the Nuseirat camp in the central Gaza Strip.

Bodies of three people recovered

Meanwhile, The bodies of three people were also recovered after the occupation aircraft bombed a civilian vehicle northeast of the Nuseirat camp. Israeli gunboats opened fire towards the western areas of the Gaza Strip, and the occupation aircraft targeted agricultural land in the town of Al-Fakhari east of Khan Yunis city in the southern Gaza Strip.

In a preliminary toll, the number of civilians killed since the beginning of the occupation's aggression on the Gaza Strip on October 7, 2023, has risen to 41,467, in addition to 95,921 wounded, the majority of whom are children and women, while thousands of missing people are still under the rubble. — Wafa

DEUTSCHE BAHN AND FRANCE'S SNCF



New train service to link Berlin and Paris in eight hours by December

BERLIN: A new high-speed train, operated by German rail operator Deutsche Bahn and France's SNCF, will allow passengers to travel between Berlin and Paris in approximately eight hours, Deutsche Bahn announced on Tuesday. The first departure is scheduled for December.

"This is the first daytime direct connection between the capitals of Germany and France, and it is also a symbol of a growing Europe," said Michael Peterson, an executive at Deutsche Bahn.

"This new connection is further proof of the Franco-German friendship and contributes to a shared goal of our two countries: more CO2-free mobility," added Alain Krakovitch from SNCF.

What will the journey look like?

The train is set to depart from Berlin at 11:54 a.m. and arrive at Paris' Gare de l'Est at 7:55 p.m. In the reverse direction, it will leave Paris at 9:55 a.m. and arrive in Berlin at 6:03 p.m.

The route will stop in Strasbourg, France, and not Saarbrücken, as initially requested by Deutsche Bahn. It will also make

stops in the German cities of Frankfurt and Karlsruhe.

Second-class tickets will be available starting at €60 (\$67), slightly more expensive than the cheapest flights between the two capitals. With this route, the number of daily connections between France and Germany will increase from 24 to 26.

Was there already a Paris-Berlin train?

Berlin and Paris have been connected by a long-distance night train service, operated by Austrian Railways, although it is currently suspended due to construction work.

Deutsche Bahn is also planning other new international connections. Among them are routes from Munich to Milan and Rome, in collaboration with Trenitalia, scheduled for 2026.

According to Peterson, demand for international train travel has grown faster than for domestic routes.

This service adds to the high-speed rail network between Germany and France, which already includes routes to Marseille and Bordeaux from Frankfurt. — DW

GLOBAL WARMING

Why are sea levels rising?

NEW YORK: "The ocean is overflowing," warned UN secretary general Antonio Guterres at a recent visit to Tonga.

The archipelago in the South Pacific is one of several countries in the region that are severely and disproportionately threatened by sea level rise.

And while low-lying islands are particularly vulnerable, many coastal communities and cities worldwide are already struggling with more destructive floods and storms that endanger lives, jobs and crucial infrastructure.

How fast are sea levels rising?

Global sea levels have risen faster since the start of the 20th century than at any point in the last 3,000 years — and the pace is only accelerating.

Since records began in 1880, they have risen more than 20 cm (more than 8 inches), and this is getting faster with each decade. Global mean sea levels hit a record height in 2023, according to the World Meteorological Organisation.

And they are not rising equally around the globe due to ocean dynamics and the Earth's unequal gravity field. In some areas of the southwestern Pacific, sea levels have risen close to twice the global rate since 1993.

How fast oceans will continue to rise depends on planetary heating.

If the world holds it below 1.5 degrees Celsius as set out in the Paris Agreement and hits net zero emissions by 2050, global sea levels are set to rise a further 38 cm by 2100. However, with current climate action setting us on a path to 2.7 degrees Celsius global warming by the end of the century this would lead to a further rise of 56 cm.

A few centimetres might not seem like much, but scientists estimate that every 2.5 cm of sea rise equates to 2.5 meters of lost beachfront and means that high tides and storm surges can reach even higher and further. Equally,



for each centimetre of sea level rise, an extra 6 million people are estimated to be exposed to coastal flooding.

In extreme cases, scientists predict that human activity could cause sea levels to rise up to two meters by the end of the century.

What is causing them to rise?

Sea level is driven by global warming, caused by carbon dioxide, methane and other emissions released from the burning of fossil fuels for uses including energy, industry, and transport.

This is making the ocean heat up. Our seas have absorbed an estimated 90% of atmospheric warming over the past 50 years, and the pace of ocean heating has doubled in the last 20 years, rising three times faster than the global average in the southwest Pacific Sea. Ocean temperatures in 2023 were the hottest on record.

When water heats up, it grows in volume due to a process known as thermal expansion. Changes in land water storage — for example, through pumping groundwater — can also lead to a net change in ocean water volume.

However, one of the major sources of sea level rise is the melting of ice sheets and mountain glaciers due to increasing heat. An average of 150 billion tonnes of ice mass are lost yearly from Antarctica and 270 billion

tonnes from Greenland.

Recent scientific reports have also raised concern about climate "tipping points," where increases in temperatures beyond 1.5 degrees Celsius could trigger the irreversible collapse of the entire Greenland and West Antarctic ice sheets, with severe repercussions for sea levels.

Which parts of the world are most impacted?

Low-lying small islands, such as Fiji, the Maldives and Tuvalu, are facing some of the most critical threats from sea level rise — with even a moderate increase posing an existential danger.

However, sea level rises pose a global threat as nearly 40% of the world's population lives near the coast and roughly 900 million in low-elevation zones.

Coastal cities and communities worldwide are already struggling with coastal erosion, agriculture and freshwater challenges due to saltwater intrusion and increasingly destructive flooding and storms.

According to a 2022 study, among the hardest hit places will be tropical regions, particularly in Asia, with Bangladesh, India, China particularly at risk. Some of the most vulnerable areas will be river deltas — broad areas where rivers meet the sea, often where port cities are located.

Megacities such as Cairo, La-

gos, Los Angeles, Mumbai, Buenos Aires and London are all expected to face serious impacts.

What can be done to respond?

Ultimately, experts say the solution to preventing dramatic sea level rise lies in rapidly reducing emissions.

However, some degree of sea level rise is now inevitable — this is because even if the world stops emitting all greenhouse gases tomorrow, there is a time lag in the effect global heating has on ocean temperatures and ice and glacier melting.

Countries worldwide are employing a range of adaptation measures, from creating sea walls and storm surge barriers to improving drainage systems and flood resistant buildings.

Some of the adaptation measures are simple and nature based: from staving off coastal erosion by driving wooden stakes into Senegal's beaches or regenerating mangrove forests in Cameroon.

For low lying small island states responses to sea level rise include moving entire villages to higher ground in Fiji, building floating cities in the Maldives and reclaiming land from the sea in Tuvalu.

Many developing regions need financial help to deal with sea level rise and other consequences being felt due to climate change, experts say. — DW

Oil prices dip on worries of China stimulus plans



SINGAPORE: Oil prices fell as investors reassessed the ability of China's stimulus plans to boost the economy enough to drive more fuel demand growth in the world's largest crude importer. Brent crude futures dropped 17 cents, or 0.2%, at \$75 a barrel. US West Texas Intermediate crude fell 24 cents, or 0.3%, at \$71.32 per barrel. Prices rose about 1.7% on Tuesday after China announced its most aggressive economic stimulus since the COVID-19 pandemic, with interest rate cuts and government funding.

Gold jumps to record high on rate bets, weaker US dollar



SINGAPORE: Gold scaled another high yesterday, boosted by a softer US dollar and hopes of more interest rate cuts. Spot gold rose 0.2% to \$2,661.53 per ounce. Bullion hit an all-time high of \$2,670.43 earlier. US gold futures gained 0.3% to \$2,686.10. The dollar eased 0.2%, making greenback-priced bullion less expensive for other currency holders. Spot silver fell 0.5% to \$31.97 per ounce, platinum edged 0.1% higher to \$986.85 and palladium shed 0.6% to \$1,050.04.

US dollar falls amid major rate cut anticipation

SINGAPORE: The US dollar index fell more than 0.5% after China's aggressive stimulus moves buoyed risk appetite, with growing bets of another outsized US rate cut in November adding to headwinds for the greenback. Against a basket of currencies, the US dollar last stood at 100.26, languishing near a more than one-year low of 100.21. The Aussie peaked at \$0.6908 in the early Asian session, its highest since February 2023, while the kiwi rose to a nine-month top of \$0.63555. The onshore yuan rose to a 16-month top of 7.0012 per US dollar. Elsewhere, sterling advanced 0.1% to trade at \$1.3430, a level not seen since March 2022. The euro gained 0.14% to \$1.1195, hovering near a 13-month high hit last month, while the yen eased slightly to 143.32 per dollar. -ONA

Ex-Real Madrid and Man Utd defender Varane retires aged 31

PARIS: Former Manchester United, Real Madrid and France defender Raphael Varane retired from football at the age of 31 on Wednesday.

Varane joined Italian side Como on a free transfer in July but suffered a knee injury on his debut against Sampdoria last month.

The centre-back says he will stay at the club in a non-playing role.

"I hold myself to the highest standard, I want to go out strong,

not just holding on to the game," he wrote on Instagram. "It takes a big dose of courage to listen to your heart and your instinct."

Varane began his career at French side Lens but spent just one season in the first team before joining Real Madrid in 2011.

He enjoyed a glittering 10-year career in the Spanish capital, winning 18 trophies - including three La Liga titles and four Champions Leagues.

The defender moved to Old

Trafford in the summer 2021 for an initial £34m, going on to make 95 appearances in all competitions despite struggling with injuries.

He won the Carabao Cup in 2022 and his final appearance for the club was an FA Cup final victory over rivals Manchester City at Wembley in May. Varane made his France debut in 2013 and earned 93 caps, winning the World Cup in 2018, the Nations League in 2021 and reaching the World Cup final again in 2022.

"I have fallen and risen a thousand times, and this time, it's the moment to stop and hang my boots up with my final game winning a trophy at Wembley," he said.

"I have no regrets, I wouldn't change a thing. I have won more than I could have even dreamed of, but beyond the accolades and trophies, I am proud that no matter what, I have stuck to my principles of being sincere and have tried to leave everywhere better than I found it. I hope I have made you all proud."

On his future plans, Varane added: "A new life begins off the pitch. I will remain with Como. Just without using my boots and shin pads. Something I am looking forward to sharing more about soon."

In April, Varane said he had "damaged his body" because of the continued impact of heading the ball, and once finished a France World Cup game in 2014 on "autopilot" after playing on with concussion. He has called for greater protection and better awareness of the issue. - Agencies



Man City won't waste energy on EFL Cup, says Guardiola

Doku and Nunes scored as City defeated Watford in a third round game at the Etihad Stadium

LONDON: Manchester City boss Pep Guardiola says he is not going to "waste energy" on the EFL Cup even though no manager has been more successful than him in the competition.

City edged into the last 16 of this season's edition thanks to first-half goals from Jeremy Doku and Matheus Nunes, his first for the club, in a 2-1 win against Championship side Watford.

Only Doku and Kyle Walker kept their starting places for a game that began less than 50 hours after the enthralling 2-2 Premier League draw with Arsenal had ended.

Though, while their side included 16-year-old debutant Kaden Braithwaite, established internationals John Stones, Jack Grealish, Nunes and Phil Foden were among those to come in.

With a league game at Newcastle on Saturday lunchtime (12:30 BST), and a Wednesday tie ruled out on police grounds as Manchester United are playing at home to FC Twente in the Europa League, Guardiola opted for a quick turnaround from Sunday rather than the alternatives of switching the game to Watford or playing on Thursday.

"The next round, I announce to you, I will play the second team," said Guardiola. "We are not going to waste energy, for sure."

The fourth round is scheduled for either October 29 or 30. Al-



though there are no clashes with European fixtures in that week, Chelsea are due to play in the UEFA Conference League when the quarter-finals are scheduled in the midweek before Christmas.

Guardiola is level with Brian Clough and Sir Alex Ferguson with four triumphs in this competition. However, with additional European matches from this season, he feels he has to look at the tournament differently.

"The schedule is the schedule, we cannot handle it anyway," he said. "Today for [James] McAtee, Matheus [Nunes], Jack [Grealish], Phil [Foden], who didn't play, the young lad, 16 years old, it's perfect," he said.

"That's why it's a good competition, otherwise we wouldn't win four in a row.

"We play to go through. We never throw a competition. Never. But we played 50 hours ago. I'm not going to [take] a risk with the Premier League and the Champions League in this competition."

On a night when Braithwaite became the third-youngest player

to start a game for City, Nunes also had a night to remember, following up Doku's fifth-minute opener with a precise first-half finish.

A £53m signing from Wolves just over a year ago, Nunes has not made the impact envisaged.

The Portugal international started only seven times last season and so far this term has been limited to just 20 minutes' Premier League action across three substitute appearances.

"He has a special quality that few players have," said Guardiola. "He is excellent in space and in the transitions. I am really pleased for him. He's a lovely guy."

At Stamford Bridge, Christopher Nkunku scored a hat-trick as Chelsea cruised into the fourth round of the Carabao Cup with a convincing 5-0 win over League Two Barrow.

Nkunku opened the scoring in the eighth minute with a cool finish after a fine chipped pass from Joao Felix.

The forward soon added his second with a clever flick to divert Malo Gusto's low cross into the



net, before a Felix free-kick hit the post and bounced in off Barrow goalkeeper Paul Farman to give the Blues a 3-0 half-time lead.

Two minutes after the restart Pedro Neto scored his first Chelsea goal by tapping in after Mykhailo Mudryk's pass across goal.

Nkunku completed his hat-trick in the 75th minute after tackling keeper Farman and passing the ball into an empty net.

Thanks to his first Chelsea treble, the 26-year-old Frenchman now has six goals in eight appearances this season for the Blues.

City confirm Rodri has injured knee ligament



LONDON: Manchester City on Tuesday night have confirmed Spain midfielder Rodri suffered a knee ligament injury against Arsenal on Sunday.

Rodri was substituted in the 21st minute after he twisted the joint in a collision with Arsenal's Thomas Partey at a corner.

No timescale has yet been put on the player's recovery, but speaking after Tuesday's Carabao Cup win over Watford, Pep Guardiola said he is set for a lengthy spell on the sidelines.

"Still we don't have the definitive [diagnosis] but he will be out for a long time - a while," said the City boss. "But there are some opinions that maybe it will be less than we expected."

"We are waiting for the last phone calls from him and the doctors for what definitely he has and the type of surgery he has to get.

"We expect that tonight, tomorrow we will know exactly." Rodri has travelled to Spain

to see a specialist following initial tests in Manchester.

Guardiola has described the 28-year-old as "irreplaceable" - City have not last in the last 48 Premier League matches in which he has started - but the manager says he will find a solution in his absence.

City were beaten in four out of the five games Rodri missed last season, while he has lost just once in 50 appearances in all competitions.

He was also named player of the tournament as Spain won Euro 2024 in July and is one of the favourites to win the Ballon d'Or next month - given to the world's best player.

A week ago the former Atletico Madrid player, who played 63 times for City and Spain last season, claimed players are "close to" striking over an increase in the number of games in the calendar, including an expanded Champions League and Club World Cup. - Agencies

Nkunku was making his first start for the hosts since their opening-day defeat by Manchester City last month.

Mbappe's fine run at Real continues

MADRID: Kylian Mbappe scored in his fifth consecutive match to continue his fine start to life in a Real Madrid shirt, as his side survived a late comeback to beat Deportivo Alaves 3-2 on Tuesday.

Lucas Vazquez gave the La Liga champions the lead inside 57 seconds before Frenchman Mbappe found the net with a fine finish after being set up by Jude Bellingham. Rodrygo added a third just after the restart, but Carlos Benavidez pulled a goal back for the visitors in the 85th minute.

Deportivo's Kike Garcia then added a second a minute later to ensure a nervy finish, but Carlo Ancelotti's side were able to hang on.



Mbappe's strike means the 25-year-old now has seven goals in nine appearances this season for Real, including six in his past seven. He and Bellingham had also combined in the 23rd minute

but the forward had his strike into the bottom corner ruled out for offside. Mbappe signed a five-year deal at Real Madrid in July after the expiry of his Paris Saint-Germain contract. - Agencies

SAN SIRO STRIPPED OF HOSTING

UEFA reopens bids for 2027 Champions League final

LAUSANNE: UEFA has reopened the bidding for stadiums to host the 2027 Champions League final, after the match was stripped from Milan on Tuesday.

The San Siro was to be the venue for the showcase final but, after Milan officials failed to assure UEFA that planned redevelopment work would not hamper the event, European football's governing body opted to take it away from them.

AC Milan and Inter Milan are considering building a new stadium in the San Siro area.



The new host stadium for the 2027 final is expected to be announced in May or June 2025.

The decision was taken at a meeting of the UEFA Executive Committee on Tuesday, where

changes to the organisation's solidarity funding was also agreed.

The 'big five' European leagues - the Premier League, La Liga, Ligue 1, Serie A and Bundesliga - agreed to have their solidarity payments capped at 10m euros (£8.3m) per season up to and including 2026-27. This is an increase of 1.5m euros on the previous cycle, but there are now 308m euros (£256.3m) to be shared rather than 177.2m euros (£147.4m) in the previous cycle. The funds are allocated to clubs not participating in European competitions. - Agencies

Injury-hit Cilic creates ATP history with comeback title

HANGZHOU: Former US Open champion Marin Cilic became the lowest-ranked player to win an ATP Tour title with an emotional victory at the Hangzhou Open on Tuesday.

Croatia's Cilic, who started the tournament at 777th in the world, has spent the majority of the past two seasons out with a knee injury which required multiple surgeries.

Given a wildcard to play in Hangzhou, the former world NO.3 had not won an ATP Tour match in

22 months before this week.

On Tuesday, just four days before his 36th birthday, he beat home favourite Zhang Zhizhen 7-6 (7-5), 7-6 (7-5) to lift the title.

"It has been a difficult period for me - I lost my ranking and I didn't play too much," said Cilic, who reached a career-high ranking of third in 2018.

Cilic had the latest surgery on his right knee in May, saying it was the "best option" to help overcome the problem and return to court.

He played just two matches in 2023 and another four times at the start of this season.

The comeback began on the Challenger Tour - the tier below the main ATP events - in August before stepping up a level again over the past week in China.

Cilic hit 18 aces and won 42 of 50 first-service points (84%) against 43rd-ranked Zhang.

In his post-match speech, the 2014 US Open champion dedicated the victory to his family - including his wife and two

children - for their support during the low moments.

"Everybody at home has been with me in this difficult period, working day by day, believing and pushing me, giving me strength and spirit," Cilic said.

"I'm happy to make this victory, not just for me, but for them. For everyone there is a small piece of this trophy."

On the back of winning a 21st title of his career, Cilic will rise 404 places in the rankings to 373 next week. - Agencies
