Miller told reporters Washington was working with the mediators on what the proposal will contain and ensuring that "it's a proposal that can get the parties to an ultimate agreement."

Talks over months have so far failed to reach a deal to end war, now in its twelfth month.

Palestinian resistance movement Hamas said last week it is ready to implement a ceasefire based on the previous proposal without any new conditions from any party.

Negotiations have been ongoing to clear two main obstacles: Israel's demand to keep its forces in the Philadelphi corridor to maintain a buffer between Gaza and Egypt, and the specifics of an exchange of hostages for Palestinian

Trump suspect, staunch Ukraine backer, charged with gun crimes

man suspected of plotting to assassinate former US president Donald Trump was charged with federal gun crimes yesterday.

Ryan Wesley Routh, 58, was charged with possession of a firearm as a convicted felon and possession of a firearm with an obliterated serial number at his initial court appearance.

Routh, who was arrested on Sunday after an alleged abortive bid to shoot the Republican presidential candidate at his West Palm Beach golf course, is expected to face further charges at a later date.

Routh appeared calm during the brief court hearing before Magistrate Judge Ryon McCabe of the Southern District of Florida, an-

swering "yes" to several questions. A detention hearing was scheduled for September 23 and an arraignment on further potential charges was set for September 30.

Routh was arrested on Sunday after a Secret Service agent on the former president's security detail saw what appeared to be the barrel of a rifle pointing out of a tree line on the perimeter of the Trump International Golf Course, according to a criminal complaint filed by an FBI special agent.

"The Agent fired his/her service weapon in the direction of the rifle," the complaint said.

Routh was arrested by local police about 45 minutes later on I-95, a major north-south highway, and replied in the "affirmative" when asked if he knew why he was being stopped, it said.

According to the complaint, a "loaded SKS-style, 7.62x39 calibre rifle with a scope," a digital camera, a backpack and a black plastic bag containing food were recovered from the tree line.

Gunman spent nearly 12 hrs near golf course

Routh appears to have spent nearly 12 hours on the perimeter of the Trump golf course. "Routh's mobile phone was lo-

cated in the vicinity of the area along the tree line... from approximately 1:59am until approximately 1:31pm on September 15," the complaint said.

He was convicted in 2010 in the same state of multiple counts of possession of stolen goods, it said.

Ukraine denies links

Kyiv yesterday denied links to a man accused of trying to assassinate former US President Donald Trump, after it emerged that the suspect was a supporter of Ukraine who had said he wanted to recruit foreign volunteers to fight there. Media interviews and social media posts showed that the reported suspect was a staunch supporter of Ukraine who had travelled there after Russia's 2022 invasion.


King of Spain receives credentials of Qatar's envoy

QU scientists in precision medicine breakthrough

atar University (OU) scientists have made a major breakthrough in the field of precision medicine, offering new hope for the treatment of chronic diseases. In a recent study published in Pharmacology and Translational Science by the American Chemical Society, researchers from QU Health revealed the potential of Apabetalone (RVX-208).

The innovative epigenetic therapy, which targets the way genes are turned on or off in human bodies without changing the DNA sequence, is poised to transform the treatment of cardiovascular. renal, neurological, viral, and cancer disorders by addressing their underlying causes. Epigenetic treatments like Apabetalone block specific harmful proteins, reducing their production. Apabetalone is the only such inhibitor that has been granted a breakthrough therapy designation from the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) outside the area of oncology.

Dr Zaid al-Ma'ayah, assistant professor Pharmacology and Toxicology at QU, leading the study, said: "This work represents a new era in medicine, focusing on using epigenetics to regulate the transcription of genes involved in cardiovascular, infectious, and cancer disorders. In addition to this work, we have made numerous intriguing experimental discoveries regarding the new applications of this epigenetic therapy, which we will soon share with the scientific community. earlier in the process and affecting many biological functions. It blocks proteins that play a role in disease development, creating a new way to treat chronic illnesses. This method improves how cells

communicate locally and throughout the body, leading to better overall health and wellness. This marks a major advancement in medical science.

Because of the high impact of changes in how genes work, especially when certain proteins are modified, the researchers wanted to see how Apabetalone could help in early tests with animals. They plan to look into using Apabetalone with other treatments to make it even better at protecting health. As Apabetalone moves through clinical trials (tests in people), continued preclinical research is essential to fully understand its potential across various diseases.

This cutting-edge study was enriched by the dedicated efforts of Hevna Dhulkifle, a QU Health graduate student, whose contributions were integral to the study's findings. Dhulkifle remarked: "The state-of-the-art research facilities and the fostering environment in QU have greatly enriched my academic journey. The recent review is a testament to the university's commitment to stay at the forefront of scientific advancements. I am truly grateful to learn from and work with some of the brightest

The second film, Columbine, directed by Dominique Othenin-Girard was produced in 2022. It tells the story of a 13-year-old girl who runs away from home due to a troublesome relationship and quarrels with her mother, in order to search for her father she has never met. Her search takes her through time and she finds herself in the middle of a huge live show during a winegrowers' festival, and is dazzled by the surreal setting and is trapped in a strange world where she can rely only on her intelligence and her heart to find her way





Stagflation threat looms for Russia as growth slows

Prices for bread have jumped so much over the last few years that Russian pensioner Oleg Ivanovich sometimes has to go without. But the 67-year-old says he doesn't mind having to make sacrifices for the sake of Russia's military offensive on Ukraine.

"We'll bear with it. When the special military operation ends, prices will return to normal," he told AFP in Moscow, using the official Russian term for the offensive.

Surging prices – annual inflation came in at a little over 9% in August — is just one of the economic headaches Russia is grappling with as it has increasingly militarised its economy since ordering troops into Ukraine in February 2022.

Moscow has funnelled billions of dollars to its army, soldiers, their families and weapons makers to sustain its military campaign - a spending splurge that helped it defy Western hopes that sanctions would push it into economic collapse.

But after warning for months that the economy was overheating, the country's Central Bank has lately started mentioning the possibility of another, possibly more challenging development:

"The shortage of (labour) resources may lead to a situation where economic growth slows down, despite all the efforts to stimulate demand, with all that stimulus accelerating inflation," Central Bank Governor Elvira Nabiullina said over the summer.

"In essence, this is a stagflation scenario, which can only be stopped at the cost of a deep recession," she warned.

'De-modernising' Stagflation — a period of low or stagnant growth accompanied by high inflation — would present a fresh headache for the Kremlin, which has until now navigated the economic fallout of its offensive on Ukraine better than most believed possible.

Many experts say the system is unsustainable over the long-term record low and consumer

Moscow has increased government spending by almost 50% since sending troops into Ukraine, pushing up growth and wages.

Unemployment is at a confidence is its highest

in 15 years. But an exodus of both skilled and unskilled workers — who fled mobilisation or joined the army - has created millions of unfilled vacancies. Sanctions on Western technology have also hit productivity and damaged supply chains.

"In the long-term these demographic factors and technological issues will result in very low economic growth," Ruben Enikolopov, a Russian professor at the Barcelona School of Economics, told AFP.

"There is a high probability of a stagflation scenario in 2025 and the years after. It's not a certainty, but high likelihood," he added. That could leave the central bank - which said last week it saw "signs of slowing economic activity," and that inflation had "reached

its peak" - with few options. It has already raised interest rates to 18 percent. Some analysts expect they could reach a record 20 percent before the end of the year. That cost of borrowing hamstrings many private businesses, further

thwarting growth in parts of the economy not connected to the army.

Maxim Bouev, a professor at Moscow's New Economic School,
said Russia is trapped in a "vicious circle of inflation and military Keynesianism. The stimulus goes to war, the rest of the economy gets rising prices," he said. Russian President Vladimir Putin has hailed military spending - which he puts at "above eight percent of GDP" as a great resource that can drive growth. But many have doubts about

whether the positive spillovers are enough to offset the costs. "The economy is degrading, it is de-modernising," said Vladislav Inozemtsev, co-founder of the Center for Analysis and Strategies in Europe, a Russia-focused think tank.

"They are switching to Soviet models, Soviet standards, Soviet approaches. Technological advances are non-existent ... and development is very restrained," he added.

Many experts say the system is unsustainable over the long-term but see no short-term economic pressure that could hamper Russia's military capacity. Sergey Aleksashenko, a former deputy finance minister and now dissident living in exile, said it will take a decade before the results of Western sanctions on technology exports to Russia become "visible."

In the meantime, Moscow has the resources for a long fight. It commands around \$300bn in reserves that have not been frozen by the West, a low debt-to-GDP ratio of around 15% and has announced major tax rises to collect billions more revenue over the coming years.

"There's still a lot of room for redistributing resources. They will not stop the war because they run out of materials any time soon," Enikolopov said.

"Maybe not indefinitely," said Inozemtsev when asked how long Russia could fight.

"But for several years, they definitely have the money and resources to keep it going with the same intensity as now." - AFP



Arizona's battle over copper mine may sway US election

ative American opposition to Rio Tinto and BHP's Resolution Copper mine could prove crucial for the 2024 US presidential vote in the battleground state of Arizona, underscoring the high tension over where best to extract critical minerals for the energy transition.

The mine would, if built, supply more than a quarter of America's appetite for copper and be a key part of Washington's efforts to eat into China's role as the world's largest copper processor and consumer.

The US imports nearly half of its copper needs, according to the US Geological Survey, and its copper mine production has dipped 11% since 2021. There are only two domestic copper smelters.

Vet the underground Res mine would cause a massive crater that would swallow a religious site where Arizona's San Carlos Apache worship. That has fuelled strong opposition from all but one of the state's 22 Native American tribes, as well as the National Congress of American Indians.

An appeal was filed on Wednesday asking the US Supreme Court to block Rio and BHP's access to the land, which Congress and President Barack Obama approved in 2014 after it was added at the last minute to a must-pass military funding bill with the condition that an environmental report be published. President Donald Trump published that report in 2021, days before leaving office, a move that was reversed two months later by his successor, Joe Biden.

It is unclear whether the Supreme Court will take the case and, if it does, how or when it could rule.

Whoever wins the November 5 US election will be able to either approve the mine or keep its development essentially frozen, the step that Biden took after Arizona's 400,000 Native Americans nearly 5% of the state's population - helped deliver him and thenrunning mate Kamala Harris the state and thus helped him win the White House in 2020, according to exit polling that year.

In the 2024 presidential race, Republican Trump narrowly leads Harris, the Democratic nominee, among registered Arizona voters in a Reuters/Ipsos poll published on August 29. Arizona is one of a handful of states likely to decide the election.

Native Americans have tended to vote Democratic in the past, but many tribes in the US Southwest have cited climate change and the economy as key issues for them this year.

The San Carlos Apache and others are now flexing their electoral muscle once again, pushing Harris to block the mine if elected.

"We definitely expect Native votes to be the determining factor in Arizona," said Wendsler Nosie, head of the Apache Stronghold, a nonprofit group comprising of the San Carlos Apache and conservationists. "All Native people are watching this issue, because this sacred space is the heart of who we are."

The Harris campaign did not respond to requests for comment. Harris in 2020 told Arizona's

Native American tribes they would have a "seat at the table" if she and Biden were elected. The San Carlos Apache then made a successful appeal to Harris in 2021 to block Resolution, tribal officials told

Harris has said little about critical minerals on the 2024

campaign trail, and her aides have told Reuters she intends to be strategically ambiguous on energyrelated issues. In a statement to Reuters,

Halee Dobbins, the Republican National Committee's Arizona communications director, said Trump sees energy independence as a key concern for Native Americans and believes "Democrats have been hard at work destroying our energy supply," although she did not directly address the Resolution project.

"Team Trump in Arizona has been dedicated to uplifting the Native American people and addressing the unique challenges facing their communities," said Dobbins.

Trump has been supportive of most mining projects and said he would take steps that would support Antofagasta's controversial Twin Metals project in Minnesota "within minutes" of a second inauguration. Biden and Harris killed that project in 2022.

Some members of Trump's campaign have spoken in favour of Resolution, although he has not yet spoken about it publicly in this election cycle.

That largely pro-mining stance from Trump - and Harris' support for the Inflation Reduction Act and other climate-linked policies - has not gone unnoticed in the state, tribal activists say.

"Mobilising the Native vote is so important in Arizona," said Gunes Murat Tezcür, a political scientist at Arizona State University. The Resolution project "is going to be a big issue for the San Carlos Apache."

Dialogue

Rio Tinto, which plans to keep Resolution's copper in the US if the mine is built, said it has been trying to expand ties with the state's

tribes, including by supporting food banks after recent deadly wildfires. Fifty of Resolution's employees are San Carlos Apache.

"We continue the dialogue and agreement-making with tribes," said Vicky Peacy, who runs Resolution for Rio. The company declined to comment on the US election.

BHP, which owns 45% of the project to Rio Tinto's 55%, declined to comment.

Steve Trussell, head of the Arizona Mining Association trade group, said he worries US imports of copper will increase if Resolution is not developed and noted that China has already begun blocking exports of other critical minerals used in the climate fight.

"We'll fall further behind on clean energy and addressing climate change, which would disproportionately hurt Arizona's small towns and Native American communities more than most? he said.

It is that tension that is front of mind for Mila Besich, the Democratic mayor of Superior, Arizona, the town closest to the Resolution project. Besich, who has endorsed Harris but also supports Resolution, has been lobbying Harris' team to support the mine.

The same 2014 law that approved the federal land swap with Resolution also gives Superior access to land for economicdevelopment projects, a key appeal for Besich in a town with a 45% unemployment rate. Besich said she has not received any commitments from the Harris campaign yet, but plans to keep pressing the issue in the coming weeks.

"I'm very hopeful that as we ramp up this campaign, that the Resolution project gets the attention it deserves," said Besich. "It's starting to resonate just how important it is." — Reuters

Historic house at Education City to nurture traditional crafts

Elective courses will focus on areas including traditional painting techniques
