Sisi reviews progress of 'Housing for All Egyptians' initiative

PRIME Minister Mostafa Madbouli opened the opening of the 48th regular session of the Council of Arab Central Banks and Monetary Authorities' Governors yesterday. In his address, Prime Minister Madbouli emphasized the importance of this event in ensuring that highly complex regional and international developments. These challenges, particularly affecting governments in the Arab region, demand innovative approaches and solutions. He stressed the importance of close coordination and

cooperation between economic policy-makers and regional and international financial institutions. Madbouli urged that to overcome all of these factors have exacerbated inflationary pressures, leading to significant shifts in the performance of macroeconomic policies. He highlighted the adverse impact of economic growth and development through stability in developing countries, and ensuring

of an artificial intelligence. Despite these challenges, Madbouli reiterated that the global economy has shown resilience, enabling a gradual recovery following a period of slow but steady growth in early 2023. The prime minister underscored the importance of the Arab region's economic growth, with a particular emphasis on increasing the contribution of investments and exports to GDP.

Madbouli, he said, would emphasize a joint endeavor of all members aimed at enhancing public finance and monetary policy, increasing trade, monitoring cross-border financial flows, improving the investment climate, and strengthening institutional quality.

Enhancing int'l standards in higher education system's quality, output

PROMOTING the quality of higher education in line with international academic standards constitutes a basic component of Egypt's strategy for modernizing the entire education system especially in terms of linking the system to global science and research advancements and enabling graduates and post-graduates to gain the competitiveness required to meet the needs of local development. Evidencing this attention was the signing last week of protocols of co-operation between the Higher Education Ministry and each of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh, the International Institute for Architectural Engineering Technology and the UK Chartered Accountants Association. Co-operation with the Royal College of Surgeons, one of the world's oldest and renowned institutions with marked interest in developing the highest standards in the study and practice of surgery, is expected to involve the formation of a joint committee to oversee the accreditation of courses and the provision of training programmes for Egyptian students. Also envisaged under such co-operation is the arrangement of courses to contribute to building the capacity of teaching staff and support teams. The protocols signed with the Architectural Engineering Institute and the UK Chartered Accountants Association provide for the establishment of branches in Egypt, thereby making it possible for Egyptian universities to embrace their academic programmes and exchange knowledge and expertise, in addition to offering students the opportunity to enrich their practical skills. Just a couple of days before the signing of these protocols, Minister Ashour announced that the Ministry-based Nile Institute for Engineering had won international accreditation of the US Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET) as a quality centre for the study of engineering and computation - yet one more evidence of the fruitfulness of the strategy for upgrading higher education within the framework of the country's overall drive to reform and modernise the entire education system. And around the same time, the Higher Education Ministry invited admission to the West banking programme in the field of cloud computing and emerging technologies, in co-operation with Amazon Web Services (AWS).

Initiating co-operation with such highly specialised entities reflects Egypt's keenness to improve the quality of education and ensure that graduates are duly qualified in terms of both academic knowledge and practical training. As Minister Ashour explained in a statement on the signing ceremony noting that the number of university institutions in Egypt has grown to more than 100, Minister Ashour stressed that the ongoing drive to keep upgrading the quality of academic education aims to enable students to gain world-class knowledge and training. The Higher Education Ministry, he added, seeks to provide students with larger access to the job market through internationally-recognised graduation certificates as well as to offer higher-quality education - a process that links higher education to the requirements of sustainable development.

Breast milk optimal nutrition for babies

NEW findings, to be presented here at the American Academy of Pediatrics' meeting in Orlando, Fla., have told much about infant feeding, but especially about when and how long to breast-feed. Breastfeeding is optimal for babies.

"Although the best breastfeeding time is only a few days, it is a critical time for establishing breastfeeding, which sets the stage for the child's health and development," says Dr. Carol O'Keefe, president of the Center for Breastfeeding Medicine at Cleveland Children's Hospital Medical Center.

"The study reinforces the importance of hospital policies in supporting exclusive breastfeeding, as those early experiences may affect long-term health," she added to a meeting.

"If you think it isn't important to start breastfeeding your newborn within 24 hours of the hospital, start again," says Deborah Shinn, director of infant care at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. "You should start breastfeeding right after birth and continue to do so for at least 12 weeks."

While longer periods of exclusive breastfeeding are associated with a lower risk of childhood obesity, right after birth and before 6 and 12 weeks, the benefits are less well understood, the study authors note.

"Breast milk is the optimal nutrition for newborns, and providing infants with a diet of breast milk during the first 6 months of life is associated with a lower risk of childhood obesity, including adults," the researchers said. "Breast milk also has other benefits, including providing optimal immune system support and the benefits have been shown to improve the health of children who are not breastfed."

In the study study, 21 per cent of the 10,000 newborns remained under breast milk while still in the hospital, while 31 per cent exclusively received breast milk. In total, 3 per cent were never breastfed with mother's milk.
